

CLAIMS VERSUS FACTS ON DATA CENTERS

Public sentiment has shifted sharply: a 2026 Gallup survey found 70% of Americans oppose having a data center built in their community, a number that cuts across party lines, with Republican Governor Greg Abbott in Texas and Democratic Governor Kathy Hochul in New York alike moving to restrict new development.



CLAIM: Average people aren't receiving any benefits from data centers.

FACTS: In July 2026, Georgia Tech Scheller College of Business [found](#) employment up ~3.5%, wages up ~5%, business establishments up ~5%, and household income up ~2% in areas where data centers were constructed.



CLAIM: Data centers don't drive meaningful job creation.

FACTS: Data center projects are offering skilled trade workers some of the [highest pay and bonuses the industry has ever seen](#).



CLAIM: Opposition to data centers is wholly organic to local concerns.

X (formerly Twitter) uncovered a bot farm of around 200,000 Chinese inauthentic accounts that were posting in a way to distort the conversation around U.S. artificial intelligence, data centers, and energy policy.



The Anti-Data Center Propaganda Machine

Much of the opposition to data centers is based on false, misleading claims or outright disinformation campaigns that is partly fueled by Chinese bot farms posting on U.S. social media, and public activity from the same network financed by Beijing-based tech tycoon Neville Roy Singham.

TRUMP'S TRANSPARENCY PUSH

President Trump's transparency resulted in the declassification of documents exposing threats to election integrity, the Biden family's corrupt financial ties to Ukrainian energy interests, allegations of collusion between Trump associates and Russia, and hostile foreign interference in U.S. elections.

➔ **Noncitizens on State Voter Rolls:** In 2026, Homeland Security found that states which implemented the SAVE system to protect election integrity were able to weed out hundreds of thousands of deceased and noncitizen voters: "In the short time that the enhanced SAVE system has been available to states, 10 have states [sic] processed their full voter lists."

➔ **Maricopa County, AZ:** Between October 21, 2020, and November 2, 2020, nearly 633,000 voter records were accessed. 930 of these records contained "sensitive information," such as "domestic violence victims, Judges, and law enforcement officers."

➔ **Ukraine Corruption:** Around December 2019, the FBI Foreign Influence Task Force – Russia (FITF-R) began gathering previously reported intelligence unfavorable to Biden with the aim of showing that it was "Russian disinformation."



China's Acquisition and Exploitation of American Voter Data

Heavily redacted documents reveal that China obtained voter registration records, which included sensitive personal identifiable information (PII), from 18 states during the 2020 election.

According to Just The News, "The dump also contains evidence of a concerted effort by members of the Intelligence Community to withhold information about the breaches from then-President Trump."

CLAIMS VERSUS FACTS ON COVID-19

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the United States government created a slew of policies to attempt to counter the spread of the disease. Many of these policies were based on questionable science.



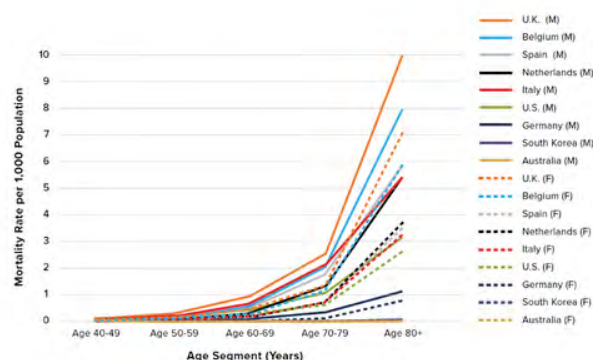
CLAIM: COVID-19 was introduced to humans, likely through an intermediate host animal, at a wet market in Wuhan, China. Early case clusters near the Huanan Seafood Market supported this view.

FACTS: After the outbreak of COVID-19, different government agencies have concluded that the virus escaped from the Wuhan Institute of Virology (WIV), which conducted coronavirus research including gain-of-function experiments.



CLAIM: Mask mandates were necessary for all individuals to reduce the transmission of COVID-19 whenever individuals were indoors and not observing social distancing.

FACTS: A 2024 retrospective event study in JMIR Public Health and Surveillance examining 51 countries found no statistically significant association between mask mandate implementation and reduced COVID-19 transmission per population level.



A major claim was COVID-19 had an incredibly high infection fatality rate to all age groups, necessitating universal policies.

Data collected by RGA's Global Data and Analytics team shows that even among the over-50 population, the fatality rate increased significantly with age.

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SUPREME COURT RULING ON BIRTHRIGHT CITIZENSHIP

On June 30, 2026, the Supreme Court ruled 6-3 in *Trump v. Barbara* to extend the 14th Amendment—which grants citizenship to everyone “born... in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof”—to children born on U.S. soil whose parents are illegal immigrants or temporary residents.

Did You Know...



According to the [pro-immigration National Immigration Forum](#), the ruling “reinforced the principle that citizenship is determined by the Constitution—not by changes in executive policy.”



According to the [Center for Immigration Studies](#), “aliens unlawfully present or seeking a more permanent residence will now have an incentive to have as many children as possible, and the taxpayer will foot the bill for many of those births.”



In July 2026, Representative John McGuire (R-VA) [introduced](#) the Birthright Citizenship Clarification Act of 2026, which excludes children born of illegal immigrants or temporary residents from those “born subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.”



While *Barbara* is a setback for the Trump administration, it has not stymied its efforts to curtail illegal immigration and birth tourism. Now, the administration aims to recall hundreds of thousands of workers currently covered by Temporary Protected Status, and administration officials have floated ideas such as barring pregnant women from entering the country.

SUPREME COURT RULING ON PROTECTIONS FOR WOMEN'S SPORTS

The Supreme Court decided in favor of the states, ruling that legislation which determines eligibility for women's and girls' sports based on biological sex was consistent with Title IX and the Equal Protection Clause.

Did You Know...

- The [core](#) ruling: "Consistent with Title IX and the Equal Protection Clause, we hold that the States may maintain women's and girls' sports for biological females. They may determine eligibility for women's and girls' sports based on biological sex. The Constitution and Title IX do not require an overhaul of women's and girls' sports throughout America."
- According to University of Cincinnati law professor Ryan Thoreson, the Court's [willingness](#) to "treat restrictions based on biological sex as benign" is a "worrying sign" for trans rights in other sex-segregated contexts — bathrooms, locker rooms, driver's licenses, passports, and the military ban.
- The ruling may [complicate](#) the Trump administration's broader pressure campaign on schools, since courts may now allow states without bans to withstand federal coercion by pointing to the ruling's limited scope.



This ruling is focused primarily on women's and girls' sports, rather than ruling more broadly on the question of allowing transgender individuals in sex-segregated spaces. There are currently [27 states](#) which have legislation that allows for sports team participation to be based on biological sex, all of which are now able to enforce this legislation under the Supreme Court's ruling.

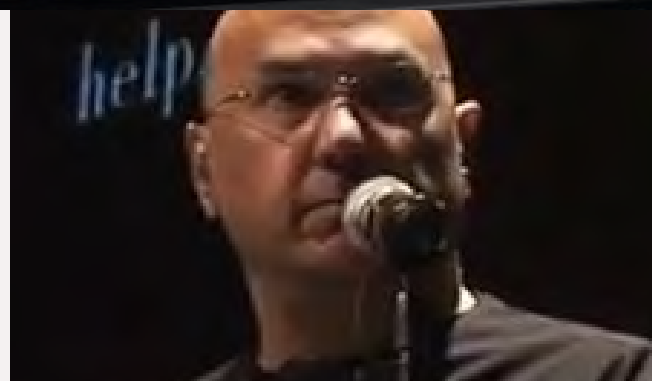
NEVILLE ROY SINGHAM

Neville Roy Singham is an American businessman who sold his tech company for \$785 million, moved to Shanghai, and has since funneled hundreds of millions of dollars into a global network of far-left groups working to undermine American foreign policy.

Did You Know...

Singham has been involved with organizations such as:

- [The ANSWER Coalition](#), a radical anti-war advocacy group with ties to Hamas and Iran, which has [partnered](#) with The People's Forum and CODEPINK on events protesting against American foreign policy.
- [The Democratic Socialists of America](#), a far-left political activist group, has been reported as working with CODEPINK in support of the Chinese Communist Party.
- [The Party for Socialism and Liberation](#), a leftist socialist political party which has publicly supported Communist leaders such as Vladimir Lenin and Mao Zedong, has participated in protests against American foreign policy with organizations including CODEPINK.



A 2026 Fox News investigative series [alleged](#) the total network spans over \$278 million in U.S.-based grants since 2017, and potentially as much as \$600 million globally across five continents, operating through nonprofits, activist groups, think tanks, and media outlets.

Singham resides in Shanghai, China and is married to Jodie Evans, co-founder of anti-war activist group CODEPINK.

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CAPITAL FLIGHT FROM HIGH-TAX STATES TO LOW-TAX STATES

Over the past few years, several high-profile companies and millions of Americans are moving out of higher-taxed states and into states with more friendly tax policies. High-tax states have all seen more outward migration, with low-tax states all benefiting from inward migration, with tax climates cited as a primary driver.

Did you know?...

- **California** – As of January 2026, California reportedly lost 11 individuals worth \$400 billion in combined wealth because of the state's consideration of a new Billionaire Tax Act. Between 2013 and 2023, California has identified a cumulative net adjusted gross income loss of approximately \$119.7 billion.
- **New York** - Between 2013 and 2023, New York has identified a cumulative net adjusted gross income loss of approximately \$102.4 billion, with 2020-21 serving as the worst year, where New York lost \$24.5 billion in adjusted gross income.
- **New Jersey** - Since 2004, New Jersey has lost an estimated \$45.5 billion in adjusted gross income to outmigration, losing \$5.27 billion alone in adjusted gross income in 2024. Between 2013 and 2023, New Jersey has identified a cumulative net adjusted gross income loss of approximately \$32.2 billion.



Why they're leaving and where they're going

High-income states losing the most taxpayers (IRS 2022–2023):

California (-100,397 filers), New York (-71,987), Illinois (-28,609), New Jersey (-19,370), Massachusetts (-15,378)

Top gaining states: Texas (+56,473), Florida (+55,359), North Carolina (+39,118), South Carolina (+29,214), Tennessee (+24,104)

SUPREME COURT'S DECISION: LOUISIANA V. CALLAIS

In the two weeks following the April 29 ruling, Republican-led legislatures in Florida, Tennessee, South Carolina, Alabama, and Louisiana have moved rapidly to redraw congressional maps that could potentially give Republicans the edge in 8 seats currently held by Democrats.

Did you know?...

- **Florida** – Governor Ron DeSantis signed a [new congressional map](#) into law within hours of the Supreme Court's ruling on April 29.
- **Tennessee** – Governor Bill Lee signed a [new congressional map](#) into law on May 7. The new boundaries are designed to give Republicans an additional seat.
- **Alabama** - On May 11, the [Supreme Court ordered](#) that petition by Alabama lawmakers that challenged the current congressional map be sent back to a lower court to consider the legality of the current map in light of the Supreme Court's ruling on Louisiana v. Callais.
- **Virginia** – On May 8, the [Virginia Supreme Court voided](#) Democrats' attempt to redraw the state's congressional map. The state Supreme Court ruled that the process of creating the referendum violated the state Constitution. This would have given Democrats the chance to win as many as four more seats.



House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries has already begun looking ahead to the [2028 elections](#). Jeffries is designing a plan to push Democratic-held states to set aside nonpartisan redistricting rules to gerrymander even more aggressively, with an eye toward producing a dozen or more new Democratic-held seats by November 2028.

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CHECK UP ON THE AMERICAN ECONOMY

Despite moderating inflation, hourly earnings, and unemployment rates, the overall sentiment about the U.S. economy remains negative, with 44% of registered voters feeling the economy is getting worse, and only 24% think it's improving.

Did you know?...

- [Headline inflation](#), which tracks key metrics of consumer spending like food, housing, and transportation, is currently at 3.3%, having fallen from a high of 9.1% in June 2022.
- [Consumers are currently paying](#) an average of \$4.11 per gallon of gasoline, an increase of 29.5% from April 2025. Gas has risen in recent months, nearing \$6.00 per gallon in California and surging by more than 40.0% in some states.
- [Auto loan debt](#) is the second largest category of debt behind mortgages. Americans owe \$1.667 trillion in auto loan debt, accounting for 8.9% of overall consumer debt. 5.2% of outstanding auto debt was at least 90 days late at the end of the fourth quarter of 2025.



In February 2026, a Pew Research report identified that 66% of Americans are very concerned about the price of food and consumer goods, 71% are very concerned about the cost of healthcare, 62% are very concerned about the cost of housing, and 51% are very concerned about the price of electricity.

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REVISIONS TO FORM 990 DISCLOSURE PROCESS

In April 2026, the Treasury Department announced that the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will revise the form 990 disclosure report for tax-exempt nonprofits. This effort is part of a broader campaign by the Trump Administration to address financial support for extremist activities through nonprofits.

Did you know?...

- The statement identified areas which will be the focus of the 990 revision process, including disclosure requirements on government contracts, government grants, and fiscal sponsorship arrangements from nonprofits.
- Future updates include expanded disclosure requirements for fiscal sponsorship agreements, including identifying project operators, fund flows between sponsor and sponsored entities, and governance/control structures.
- The Trump administration's announcement also came after the IRS issued a Whistleblower Alert on April 17, 2026, calling on the public to report misuse, diversion, or fraudulent use of federal funds by tax-exempt organizations.



In the April 2026 announcement, Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said, “We are ending the days of hiding fraud, abuse, and extremist activity behind complicated nonprofit arrangements. When bad actors misuse charitable structures, directors and officers should understand that transparency can lead to scrutiny, accountability, and liability under the law.”

PUBLIC OPINION ON THE MILITARY CONFLICT IN IRAN

A majority of voters expressed support for the limited strikes in June 2025 since they were targeting nuclear program sites, but 75% of respondents expressed concern about this conflict leading to a larger war in the Middle East.

Did you know?...

- In February 2026, an Associated Press [poll](#) found that 61% of Americans identified Iran as an “enemy” of the United States.
- In April 2026, only 25% of voters [felt](#) it was likely that Iran would honor a promise to not pursue nuclear weapons if it maintained its nuclear program.
- In a March 2026 poll, 45% of [respondents](#) said they would be less likely to support conflict with Iran if oil or gas prices rise.
- In April 2026, only 35% of [Americans](#) were very or somewhat confident in President Trump’s ability to make good policy decisions about Iran.
- In April 2026, 62% of Americans were [reported](#) as feeling President Trump did not have a clear plan for the conflict with Iran.



At the beginning of Iran conflict in 2026, the conflict was broadly opposed by Americans, with the majority of respondents opposed to sending American Troops into Iran and expressed concerns about the U.S. military becoming too involved in Iran.

In March 2026, 75% of [Americans](#) were reported as concerned about the U.S. getting "too involved" in Iran, and 79% were concerned “about terror attacks on the U.S. as a result of the U.S. military action.”

RESIGNATIONS FROM CONGRESS OVER SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

Since 1990, there have been at least fifteen examples of elected members of Congress resigning from office over allegations of sexual misconduct. These resignations included Republican and Democrat officials engaging in immoral or illegal acts against male and female staffers, abusing their power.

Did you know?...

➔ **Rep. Anthony Weiner (D-NY)** — In June 2011, Representative Weiner [resigned](#) from office after he sent sexually explicit texts to women who were not his wife, including to a 15-year-old girl. Since leaving Congress, Anthony Weiner has [run](#) for the New York City Council in 2025 and [founded](#) his own lobbying firm.

➔ **Sen. Al Franken (D-MN)** — In January 2018, Senator Franken [resigned](#) after allegations of sexual misconduct and unwanted touching by multiple women, including the [release](#) of a photograph of Senator Franken touching a woman sexually while the woman was asleep.

➔ **Rep. Mel Reynolds (D-IL)** — In September 1995, Representative Reynolds resigned from office after a [conviction](#) in state court of criminal sexual assault, aggravated sexual abuse, solicitation of child pornography, and obstruction of justice. Mel Reynolds [served](#) 42 months of his 78-month sentence after President Bill Clinton commuted it.



In April 2026, **Rep. Eric Swalwell** resigned after allegations were made by multiple women of sexual harassment, and at least two allegations of rape were made by a former staffer.

Additionally, **Rep. Tony Gonzales** resigned after allegations of sexual misconduct towards staffers and allegations that he “discriminated unfairly by dispensing special favors or privileges.” One staffer, with whom Gonzales admitted having an affair, later committed suicide.

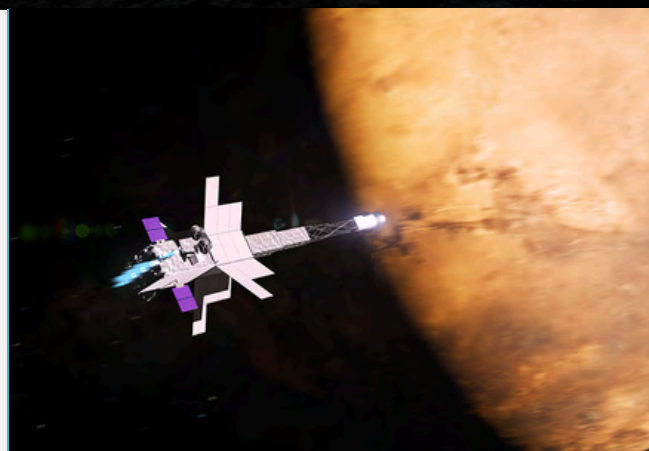


THE FUTURE OF AMERICAN SPACE TRAVEL

NASA's Artemis II mission has sparked the beginning of a new wave of space travel, aimed at the Moon and beyond. The United States plans to send several Artemis missions over the next few years, including manned missions to the Moon and working to establish a permanent settlement.

Did you know?...

- Artemis III is scheduled to [launch](#) in mid-2027 for a crewed Low Earth Orbit mission, testing rendezvous and docking between Orion and commercial lunar landers with the stated purpose to validate docking/transfer procedures before committing crew to a lunar surface descent.
- Artemis V is scheduled to [launch](#) in late 2028 for a crewed Moon landing, the goal of which will be the beginnings of construction of the Artemis Base Camp, a permanent settlement which is currently estimated to be completed in the 2030s.
- In March 2026, NASA unveiled a [plan](#) for a \$20 billion seven-year plan to build a base on the Moon, with Elon Musk's SpaceX commenting that they have shifted focus to developing a "self-growing city" on the Moon.



NASA Unveils Nuclear-Powered Mission as First Step Toward Mars

During the buildup to the Artemis II launch, NASA announced their commitment to producing nuclear-powered vessels to advance future space programs, including future missions to Mars.

Space Reactor 1 Freedom will be the first mission to Mars, utilizing a nuclear-powered unmanned vessel to learn more about the red planet.

BIRTHRIGHT CITIZENSHIP IN THE UNITED STATES

Since the 1800s, the United States has operated under the policy of birthright citizenship, whereby any child born in the United States receives citizenship, regardless of their immigration status or the residency of their parents. Opponents argue that it incentivizes illegal immigration.

Did you know?...

- • Opponents argue that the existence of birthright citizenship in the United States incentivizes immigrants to potentially take advantage of this policy to have children in the United States.
- • Based on professional analysis, it is [estimated](#) that long-term undocumented immigrants have between 225,000 and 250,000 births each year.
- • Between 33,000 and 36,000 births are [estimated](#) to occur annually because of the birth tourism industry, where individuals travel to the United States for the purpose of having children here.
- • As the human cost of border crossing [continues](#) to remain severe and well-documented, cases have occurred where women have been [harmed](#) and died trying to enter the United States illegally while pregnant



Birthright Citizenship Around the Globe

United States policy of automatic unconditional citizenship to anyone born on its soil is relatively rare, being one of only 36 countries in the world offering such a policy.

Furthermore, many countries which famously operate under socialist democratic systems do not allow for birthright citizenship

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IMPACT OF THE DHS SHUTDOWN

In February 2026, the funding for the Department of Homeland Security lapsed and, as of March 24, 2026, has yet to be restored by an act of Congress. Experts warn that this shutdown could potentially impact immigration services and domestic security efforts.

Did you know?...

- When the DHS shutdown began, 1,453 of the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) 2,341 employees — approximately 62% of the workforce — were [furloughed](#). CISA is now operating at approximately 38% of its normal staffing capacity.
- National security experts [raised](#) concerns that the partial government shutdown of DHS could lead to Iran targeting the United States with acts of terrorism.
- As airports are overstretched, TSA has [received](#) support from ICE agents, who have been deployed to fill in staffing gaps. These deployments mean they cannot pursue immigration operations as they support airport travel concerns.
- Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is [operating](#) without funding due to the shutdown. As a result, FEMA has only the funds on hand, estimated to be a few billion, to respond to major disasters.



Airports could close, Transportation Secretary warns

Wait times at airport security lines have [continued](#) to rise since the shutdown began and TSA agents stopped receiving pay, with wait times at major airports such as Houston and Atlanta reaching two hours in March 2026.

In March 2026, Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy [warned](#) some airports could close if conditions worsen under the ongoing funding debate.

FACTS BEHIND THE SAVE AMERICA ACT

The SAVE America Act would require documented proof of U.S. citizenship when registering to vote, routine maintenance of voter rolls, and require photo identification to vote in federal elections. On February 11, 2026, the bill passed the House of Representatives 218-213 and is now under consideration in the Senate.

Did you know?...

- The bill [prohibits](#) a state or local election official from providing a ballot for a federal election to an individual who does not present valid physical photo identification.
- [Each state would be required](#) on an ongoing basis to ensure that only U.S. citizens are registered to vote. This includes establishing a program to identify individuals who are not U.S. citizens using information supplied by certain sources.
- Under [current voter registration](#) processes, applicants generally do not have to provide documentary proof of citizenship. Instead, applicants attest to citizenship under penalty of perjury. Plus, there's currently no uniform method for verifying absentee votes.
- On March 15, 2026, Senator Chuck [Schumer](#) [said](#): “Not a single Democrat will support the SAVE Act. It is a radical bill.” He also called it “a voter suppression bill.”



What is the SAVE America Act all about?

The SAVE America Act would require proof of citizenship when registering to vote. Documented proof of U.S. citizenship is defined as identification that complies with the REAL ID Act of 2005 that indicates U.S. citizenship, including a valid U.S. passport or a valid government-issued photo identification card that shows the applicant's place of birth was in the United States.

- The top five most expensive states for electricity have [mandates](#) requiring 100% of their power to come from renewable or carbon-free sources.



Blue State Insurance Premiums Soar Under Democrat Policies

In 1988, [California passed Proposition 103](#), which regulates home, auto and other types of insurance by requiring insurance companies to seek approval from an elected insurance commissioner to raise their premiums.

While this can save consumers money in the short term, it eventually [forces insurers to pull coverage](#) entirely from risky areas. A notable example are the recent wildfires in Los Angeles.

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FACTS ABOUT THE ENDANGERMENT FINDING

In February 2026, the Trump Administration announced it would be repealing the Endangerment Finding. It has been used to impose regulations on a variety of industries, including the auto manufacturing industry, with estimated costs exceeding \$1 trillion since its implementation.

Did you know?...

- When the Endangerment Finding's repeal was announced, the EPA [projected](#) that it would reduce the average cost of purchasing a new car by more than \$2,400.
- [According](#) to Federal Register of the National Archives, the best available data indicate that greenhouse gas emissions from light and medium-duty vehicles in the United States amounted for approximately 1.8% of global greenhouse gas emissions in 2022.
- Previous administrations have at times relied on executive action rather than pursuing [legislation](#) through Congress. For example, President Obama supported cap-and-trade legislation, but it did not pass the Senate.



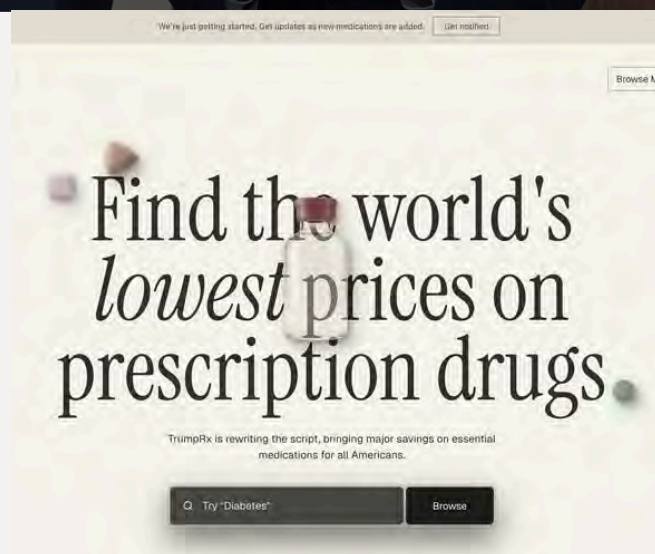
The Endangerment Finding was **issued** by the Obama Administration in 2009, determining that carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases endanger public health and welfare and may be regulated under the Clean Air Act. It served as the legal justification for several regulations, including auto emission standards, power plant emission rules, and standards for oil and gas facilities.

TRUMPRX LAUNCH & RECEPTION

TrumpRx.gov is a government-supported website to connect Americans with prescription drugs at a discounted rate. The website connects directly to pharmaceutical companies where transactions take place and does not go through insurance. This is an effort to provide relief for skyrocketing prescription drug prices in the United States.

Did you know?...

- ➔ In February 2026, the Trump Administration **launched** TrumpRx.gov, a website designed to help Americans access prescription drugs at discounted prices.
 - o The White House fact sheet stated TrumpRx **offered** medications at a steep discount, including Novo Nordisk's Wegovy pills for as little as \$149 a month, down from \$1,349.
- ➔ In 2022, the Department of Health and Human Services **found** that U.S. prescription drug prices are nearly 2.78 times higher as prices in comparison to other developed countries.
- ➔ Upon launch of TrumpRx.gov, there has been support for the increased access to drugs not covered by insurance by politicians, including Senator Bernie Sanders' office, and by industry insiders.



At launch, TrumpRx.gov offers 43 medications at reduced prices. TrumpRx provides information on discounts, but does not sell the medications directly, instead sending users to the pharmaceutical companies while not utilizing insurance.

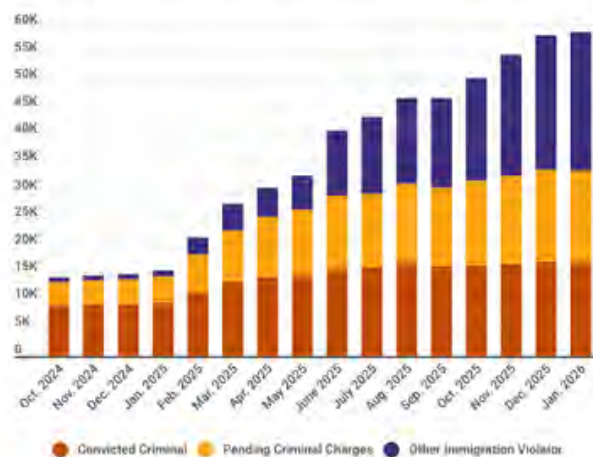
BREAKDOWN OF ARRESTS BY ICE IN MINNESOTA

Minnesota has seen over 1,694 arrests in 2025, with 37% of arrestees having a prior criminal record and 19% of arrestees facing pending criminal charges. Since the beginning of “Operation Metro Surge” in late 2025, ICE has identified more than 3,000 arrests, though official numbers have yet to be released.

Did you know?...

- ➔ Minnesota has seen at least 1,694 arrests in 2025, prior to the launch of Operation Metro Surge.
 - From January 20, 2025, through October 15, 2025, ICE [made](#) 1,694 arrests in Minnesota.
 - Of those 1,694 arrests, ICE [identified](#) 44% of arrestees with civil immigration violations (no criminal record), 37% of arrestees with prior criminal record, and 19% of arrestees with pending charges.
- ➔ In January 2026, DHS [identified](#) 212 illegal immigrants as the “worst of the worst” on its website with the following breakdowns:
 - 75 arrested for Violent crime (homicide, assault, domestic violence) or gang affiliation
 - 28 arrested for Sex Offenses, Rape, Or Criminal Sexual Conduct
 - 45 arrested for Fraud, Theft, Illegal Reentry, or Trafficking
 - 57 for drugs

National ICE Statistics

Under President Trump, there has been an increase of individuals detained by ICE, with the amount of those detained without criminal convictions or pending charges rising as well.

Between January 20, 2025, and June 26, 2025, ICE has [carried](#) out roughly 220,802 arrests nationwide. Of those arrested during this period, 36.5% of those had been convicted of a crime and 29.8% had pending criminal charges.

GREENLAND FACTS

As international powers expand their global footprints, with both Russia and China developing more advanced military capacities, the United States has considered expanding defensive capabilities in Greenland.

Did you know?...

- The US has [operated](#) Pituffik Space Base - formerly known as Thule Air Base - since World War Two, operating as America's northernmost installation. Pituffik supports missile warning, missile defense, and space surveillance operations for the U.S. and NATO.
- In response to concerns over missile threats from Russia and China, President Trump has [pledged](#) to construct the next generation of missile defense called the "Golden Dome," a ground- and space-based capabilities center that can detect and stop missiles at all four major stages of a potential attack.
- Using a geology-based assessment [methodology](#), the U.S. Geological Survey estimated undiscovered, technically recoverable resources of 7.8 billion barrels of oil and 91.9 trillion cubic feet of gas in the West Greenland-East Canada Province. Using [current](#) EIA-style price anchors, this amounts to over \$1.0 trillion in gross value for the entire province.



Concern Grows Over China's Potential Access to Rare Earth Elements

Over the past several years, China has expressed interest in investing in Greenland to expand its infrastructure. Greenland holds vast strategic reserves of natural resources, including rare earth elements; the wealth and access to these materials remain a consideration for the United States.

Greenland [ranks](#) eighth globally for rare earth reserves, with 1.5 million tons, and is home to two of the largest rare earth deposits in the world.

HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS IN VENEZUELA

While the removal of Maduro from power marks the end of a 25-year-long authoritarian dictatorship which first began under Hugo Chavez, it presents an uneasy path ahead for Venezuela with global implications.

Did you know?...

- ➔ According to a 2020 report [authored](#) by the United Nations Independent International Fact-Finding Mission on Venezuela, the experts on this mission documented **53 extrajudicial executions** and reviewed **2,552 additional incidents** involving **5,094 killings** by security forces.
- ➔ In November 2020, Venezuelan prisons and intelligence headquarters held [nearly 400 political prisoners](#), according to the Penal Forum, a Venezuelan network of pro-bono criminal defense lawyers.
- ➔ According to the United Nations, after a review by experts involving interviews and case studies, **110 documented cases were identified** where the Bolivarian National Intelligence Service targeted political dissidents, human rights activists, and others perceived to be opponents.

The security services operating in Venezuela have **tortured detainees**, including political dissidents and human rights activists, using beatings, asphyxiation and sexual violence.



Venezuela's Human Rights Crisis and the Refugee Exodus

Beyond extrajudicial killings, detentions due to political persecution, use of torture, and limits on freedom of expression have been documented by the United Nations and Human Rights Watch. These human rights violations have led to an explosion of refugees fleeing Venezuela, with over **4.5 million refugees** identified during a six-year period.

VENEZUELA AFTER MADURO

While the removal of Maduro from power marks the end of a 25-year-long authoritarian dictatorship which first began under Hugo Chavez, it presents an uneasy path ahead for Venezuela with global implications.

Did you know?...

- [Multiple Latin American countries condemned](#) the US operation in Venezuela, while others expressed that the removal of Maduro was necessary. Following the operation, President Trump also mulled [pursuing similar military action against Colombia](#).
- The US military action in Venezuela diminished the geopolitical reach of multiple adversarial nations. With the removal of Maduro from power, [China, Russia, and Iran have lost an important partner](#) in the Western Hemisphere.
- Operation Absolute Resolve is similar in nature to the [1989 US invasion of Panama](#), with both actions being conducted under Article II of the US Constitution, allowing for the removal of a foreign leader with existing US indictments from power so they may face criminal justice in US courts.



Post-Maduro Venezuela Seeks a New Path with Washington

While the immediate objectives of Operation Absolute Resolve were achieved, the political outcome for Venezuela remains uncertain.

Vice President Delcy Rodríguez, who was [appointed interim president of Venezuela](#) following Maduro's capture, called for a "balanced and respectful" relationship with the US, [inviting the US government to work together](#) "on an agenda for cooperation that is aimed toward shared development."

STATE OF THE AMERICAN ECONOMY

Despite improvements in key economic indicators, the overall sentiment about the U.S. economy remains negative, with 51% of registered voters feeling the economy is getting worse, and only 26% think it's improving.

Did you know?...

- The overall sentiment of the U.S. economy is negative, with 41% of registered voters rating the economy as Poor, the highest number of voters to rate the economy this way since the tariffs were announced in April.
- [Headline inflation](#) is currently at 3.0% having fallen from a high of 9.1% in June 2022. Americans have seen a [0.8 increase in real average hourly earnings](#) since last year, after adjusting for inflation. The [national unemployment rate is currently at 4.3%](#).
- [Consumers are currently paying](#) an average of \$3.08 per gallon of gasoline, continuing a downward trend. In May 2024, the average cost of a gallon of gasoline was \$3.61.
- The price of eggs has dropped over 64% since President Trump took office. On January 21, a carton of eggs cost \$6.49. As of December 5, a carton of eggs costs \$2.38 [according to the USDA](#).



Only 25% Rate Economy as Good in New Poll

According to a [December 2025 poll](#) by Napolitan News Service, 25% of registered voters rate the economy as Good or Excellent, with 41% of the voters rating the economy as Poor. 26% of voters say the economy is getting better, and 51% of voters believe the economy is getting worse.

Federal investigators warn Minnesota welfare fraud may have helped fund Al-Shabaab



IMPACT OF WELFARE FRAUD ON THE AMERICAN PEOPLE

The rampant abuse of welfare programs over the past several years has created a public perception that fraud has become pervasive and extensive across many government programs. As highly publicized evidence of fraud increases, hardworking Americans are paying the cost in higher taxes and less take-home pay.

Did you know?...

- ➔ SNAP benefits, used to provide food to low-income families, is [a common target](#) for welfare fraud, with an estimated \$1.27 billion stolen annually between 2015 and 2017.
- ➔ In March 2025, two individuals were [convicted](#) for their role in a \$250 million fraud scheme from a federally funded child nutrition program using an alleged nonprofit called Feeding Our Future.
- ➔ In February 2025, a Philadelphia store owner was [sentenced](#) to prison, to pay \$1,841,402 in restitution, and to forfeit the proceeds of her offenses for defrauding the U.S. government.
- ➔ In August 2025, the owner of a Chicago grocery store was [sentenced](#) to federal prison for fraudulently redeeming more than \$8.3 million in benefits under SNAP and WIC.



Welfare Abuse Drives Tax Hikes, Squeezing Christmas Budgets

As welfare and entitlement program abuse rises, the average American can be financially impacted.

As employers are [responsible](#) for paying unemployment insurance, pervasive fraud can [lead](#) to a rise in employee payroll tax rates and a decrease in wages and an increase in prices for goods and services.



PRESIDENT TRUMP'S HISTORIC SECOND TERM FOREIGN POLICY ACHIEVEMENTS

Since entering office in January, Trump has proven his critics wrong by notching major foreign policy successes. - ➔ In June 2025, President Trump attended the NATO summit in The Hague to set a deadline for increased defense spending among NATO members. [Trump has criticized](#) European defense budgets since the beginning of his first term. [Trump received praise](#) for his efforts from senior leaders across Europe and the media.
- ➔ On July 27, 2025, [President Trump](#) announced a trade deal between the United States and the European Union (EU) with the goal of rebalancing the economic relationship between the world's two largest economies.



How Tariff Escalations Led to Global Negotiations

On April 2, 2025, President Trump announced the [most significant U.S. tariff increases in nearly a century](#). A week later he announced these tariffs would be paused for 90 days, apart from a 10% base tariff rate, to allow time for negotiations.

The Trump Administration has since announced preliminary trade agreements with 7 partners: Indonesia, Vietnam, the Philippines, South Korea, the United Kingdom, the European Union, and Japan.

THE FACTS BEHIND ZOHRAN MAMDANI'S POLICY PROPOSALS

Zohran Mamdani has a double-digit lead in the polls to become the next Mayor of New York City. Mamdani has proposed a plan to raise \$10 billion in new revenue, with \$9 billion coming from new taxes, to pay for the costs of his other policy proposals.

Did you know?...

- ➔ Mamdani has proposed creating a new Department of Public Safety. The goal of this [new city agency](#) would be to reduce crime through no-police measures such as mental health outreach teams. Mamdani has said this would require a budget of [\\$1.1 billion](#).
- ➔ Mamdani pledged to spend [\\$57 million](#) on medical centers and nonprofits that provide gender-affirming care, and a further \$8 million to develop new resources including greater telehealth accessibility and an “Access Hub” to help care seekers find providers.
- ➔ Mamdani has a plan to create a [network of city owned grocery stores](#). The [city would pay to cover the cost of rent, utilities, and property taxes](#). Food policy experts estimate that it would cost \$100 million annually for five grocery stores. They estimate a network of [20 stores would cost \\$400 million annually](#).



Mamdani Unveils \$10 Billion Plan for NYC Funded by Major Tax Hikes on Businesses and Millionaires

Mamdani has released a [plan](#) to raise \$10 billion for New York City. He wants to raise \$9 billion of this from additional taxes on New Yorkers and their businesses.

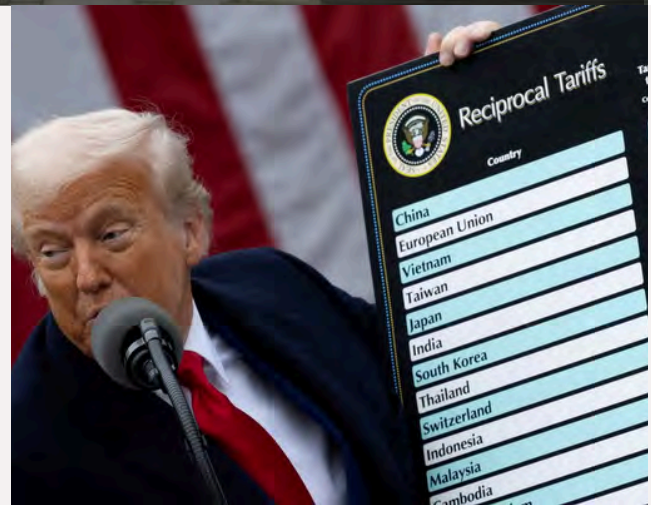
- Mamdani wants to raise the top state [Corporate Tax](#) rate to 11.5 percent. He estimates this would raise \$5 billion a year.
- Mamdani wants to increase the [New York City Income Tax](#) for anyone making more than \$1 million a year by 2 percent. He estimates this would raise \$4 billion a year.
- Mamdani wants to hire more tax auditors would bring in at least \$165 million in additional tax revenues.

FACTS BEHIND THE GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN

The government shutdown has led to many departments, including the Department of State, HUD, and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, to warn the services of many programs will be reduced due to funding issues.

Trump Worked to Keep WIC Funded Amid Shutdown

The Trump Administration has worked to ensure funding is available to as many programs as possible, including paying military personnel and funding WIC.

After the government shutdown began, the Trump Administration kept WIC (Women, Infants, and Children) program operational with a \$300M transfer of unspent tariff revenue by USDA.

FACTS BEHIND THE SHUTDOWN

In October 2025, the U.S. Government experienced its first government shutdown since 2019 due to an impasse between Republicans and Democrats over funding priorities.

Did you know?...

- While Republicans do have majorities in the House of Representatives and the Senate, the Senate's filibuster [requires](#) 60 votes to pass legislation to fund the government, leading to the Democrats in the Senate holding the continuing resolution hostage.
- After previous votes to fund the government on short term continuing resolutions, Democrats are now refusing Republican legislation to re-open the government until the Affordable Care Act subsidies are extended.
- Polling conducted by Napolitan News Service immediately after the government shutdown began on 1,000 registered voters shows that 71% of respondents said they were sure a partial shutdown of the federal government was occurring and 61% of respondents felt the shutdown had hardly any or no impact on their lives.



History Repeats? Democrats' 2018 Shutdown Standoff Ended with Border Wall Funding

From December 2018 through January 2019, the government shut down for thirty-five days after Democrats [refused](#) to consider additional funding for a southern border wall. When a clean government re-opening was agreed to, funding was later allocated to address border wall construction.

EXPLORING TYLENOL USE & AUTISM RISK

In September 2025, President Trump and members of his administration announced that the FDA will notify doctors that the use of Tylenol (acetaminophen) during pregnancy can be associated with an increased risk of autism development.

Did you know?...

- ➔ Martin A. Makary, the Commissioner of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), [said](#), “To quote the dean of the Harvard School of Public Health, there is a causal relationship between prenatal acetaminophen use and neurodevelopmental disorders of ADHD and autism spectrum disorder.”
- ➔ Several large-scale studies, including the Nurses’ Health Study II and Boston Birth Cohort, have [reported](#) associations between prenatal acetaminophen exposure and later autism or ADHD diagnoses. Johns Hopkins, and Mount Sinai have also echoed those concerns.
- ➔ Tylenol maker Kenvue [said](#) that it “strongly disagrees” that acetaminophen causes autism and said it is “deeply concerned about the health risks and confusion this poses for expecting mothers and parents.”



FDA’s 2014 Acetaminophen Limits Linked to Drop in Severe Liver Injuries, Study Finds

In 2014, the FDA limited the use of acetaminophen to prevent liver damage in users.

In March 2023, Weill Cornell Medicine [published](#) a news statement saying the acetaminophen limit was “significantly associated with subsequent reductions in serious liver injury, according to a study led by investigators at the University of Alabama and Weill Cornell Medicine.”

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CITY CRIME STATISTICS

President Trump's recent executive orders that declared a "crime emergency" in Washington D.C. and mobilization of the National Guard have resulted in measurable reduction in crime.

Did you know?...

- On September 2, 2025, President Trump said he was [considering](#) deploying the National Guard to help fight crime in Chicago. Chicago is [currently](#) experiencing a 20-year high of aggravated results and a high rate of robberies and other crimes. Illinois Governor J.B. Pritzker has said that there is [no crime emergency in Chicago](#).
- Charlotte has experienced a small but steady increase in overall violent crimes since 2022. This includes a constant rise in aggravated assaults and an overall high number of property crimes and vehicle thefts.
- Memphis has the highest rate of crime (murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) of any big city in the United States, [according to the FBI](#). Memphis has 2,501 violent crimes per 100,000 people. [Memphis Mayor Paul Young](#) has asserted that he is not happy about the introduction of the National Guard to his city, saying he did not ask for a deployment and does not think it will reduce crime.



Crime Has Decreased In D.C. Since The "Crime Emergency" Was Declared

On August 11, 2025, President Trump declared a "[crime emergency](#)" in Washington D.C. and [mobilized the National Guard](#) to assist in maintaining order in the city. Over the past 30 days, the city has seen a reduction in crime across multiple metrics.

According to the [White House](#), more than 2,100 arrests have been made in this period, including more than 20 suspected gang members. 222 firearms have been seized, and 50 homeless encampments have been taken down.

EXPLORING THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION'S CONTINUOUS VETTING FOR VISA HOLDERS

In August 2025, the Trump Admin. announced a policy of “continuous vetting” of all U.S. visa holders for potential violations that violate their conditions to stay in the United States.

Did you know?...

- In February 2024, Moctar Ahmadou, a citizen of Niger, was [sentenced](#) to 78 months in federal prison for illegal firearm possession. Ahmadou held a non-immigrant F1 visa and violated the terms of his visa with the possession of firearms. At his hearing, the court learned about Ahmadou's “downloading of jihad videos including beheadings and that he discussed the possibility of traveling to Palestine to commit jihad.”
- In February 2025, Mackendy Darbouze was [arrested](#) after police found three deceased individuals and a bloody knife at a residence and charged him with three counts of first-degree murder. Darbouze entered the U.S. legally and was held by ICE while in custody for murder.
- In January 2025, Piero Estefano But-Castillo was [charged](#) with murder, resisting an officer with violence, battery, and criminal mischief after he fatally beat 55-year-old Robert Krusinowski at a motel in Kissimmee, Florida. But-Castillo originally entered the U.S. in 2019 as a non-immigrant student, left, then returned January 1, 2025, on a 90-day tourist visa. The murder occurred on January 8, 2025 (one week after re-entry).



6,000 Student Visas Revoked in August Amid Crime and Terror Concerns

According to the State Department, this effort includes analysis such as “any indicators of overstay, criminal activity, threats to public safety, engaging in any form of terrorist activity, or providing support to a terrorist organization.”

In August, the State Department [announced](#) the revocation of more than 6,000 student visas due to issues including overstay, assault, burglary, and support for terrorism.

DC CITY CRIME

The Biden DOJ and Washington D.C. leaders have touted a drastic decrease in violent crime in the capital over the past several years. However, there have been multiple reports that the Metropolitan Police Department has been falsifying crime data.

Did you know?...

- ➔ D.C. Mayor Muriel Bowser recently claimed that [“we are not experiencing a spike in crime”](#) and “in fact, we’re watching our crime numbers go down.”
- ➔ The Trump White House has [stated](#) that Metro Police Department (MPD) leadership is allegedly “cooking the books” to make crime statistics appear more favorable than they are.
- ➔ [Carjackings](#) have increased by 547% between 2018 and 2023. Vehicle theft in D.C. is more than three times the national average.
- ➔ Washington Examiner reporter Anna Giaritelli, who was sexually assaulted in DC in 2020, explained in a recent op-ed how her case and potentially many other sexual assault cases were [deliberately left out](#) of the city’s crime statistics.



D.C. Homicide Rate Doubles in a Decade, Now Among Nation’s Highest

Washington, DC saw a homicide rate of 27.3 per 100,000 residents in 2024, which was the [fourth-highest homicide rate in the country](#), putting it above cities such as New York, Atlanta, and Chicago. In 2012, the homicide rate in Washington, D.C. was just 13.9 per 100,000 residents. If D.C. were a state, it would have the [highest homicide rate in the country](#).

THE RUSSIA COLLUSION HOAX AND ITS CONNECTIONS TO HILLARY CLINTON AND GEORGE SOROS

During the 2016 election, speculation fueled by mainstream and liberal media outlets created a public perception that Donald Trump was in cahoots with the Russians to improve his chances of winning the election.

Did you know?...

- In July 2016, President Obama was [briefed](#) on a plan allegedly by one of Clinton's campaign foreign policy advisors "to vilify Donald Trump by stirring up a scandal claiming interference by the Russian security service."
- On July 27, 2016, a top Soros Foundation official allegedly [sent an email](#) stating that Hillary Clinton "approved Julia's idea about Trump and Russian hackers hampering U.S. elections. That should distract people from her own missing emails, especially if the affair goes to the Olympic level."
- Prior to the Durham report being declassified, numerous news sources amplified the Russia collusion hoax or falsely claimed there was no connection between the Clinton campaign and the Russian-Trump allegations.



Sen. Grassley: FBI Buried Clinton-Trump Narrative Intel Until 2025

The lack of disclosure of these documents until 2025 was criticized by Chairman Chuck Grassley, who [said](#) "Based on the Durham annex, the Obama FBI failed to adequately review and investigate intelligence reports showing the Clinton campaign may have been ginning up the fake Trump-Russia narrative for Clinton's political gain, which was ultimately done through the Steele Dossier and other means. These intelligence reports and related records, whether true or false, were buried for years."

THE SHOCKING STATISTICS OF AMERICA'S FAILING SCHOOL DISTRICTS

Over the past two years, public school systems across the country have continued to struggle with plummeting student proficiency rates in reading and math.

Did you know?...

- ➔ In [2024](#), only 23 percent of Chicago's fourth graders were proficient in reading, and 21 percent were in math. Only 27 percent of eighth graders were proficient in reading and 21 percent in math.
- ➔ [In Denver](#), only 31 percent of eighth graders were proficient in reading, and just 24 percent reached proficiency in math.
- ➔ [In Oakland](#), the crisis is especially alarming for students of color, with 80 percent of Black and Brown students unable to read at grade level.
- ➔ Philadelphia School district is in the midst of a [civil rights probe](#) for failing to protect Jewish students from harassment, despite only 18 percent of eighth graders were proficient in reading and 15 percent proficiency in math.



Controversy Over DEI Initiatives at Failing Schools

In 2024, Parents Defending Public Schools filed a [federal civil rights complaint](#) against Denver Public Schools for requiring staff to participate in a "Black Excellence" pledge while the school system overall had poor performance.

[The Education Department](#) recently put out a letter stating, "treating students differently on the basis of race to achieve nebulous goals such as diversity, racial balancing, social justice, or equity is illegal."

THE RISING TIDE AND HIDDEN COST OF SOCIALISM

Over the past several years, the United States has seen an increase in people identifying as socialist or supporting socialist policies. Socialist policy proposals, such as Medicare for All and the Green New Deal, have been found to be popular with voters, but would result in trillions of dollars in new taxes on Americans.

Did you know?...

- ➔ In a [Gallup poll](#), 43% of Americans say socialism would be a good thing for the country. In contrast, a [1942 survey found](#) that only 25% of the country felt socialism in America would be a good thing.
- ➔ [In 2023](#), there were 8 members of the United States Congress who identified as socialists, with 5 of those individual's members of the Democratic Socialists of America.
- ➔ [The Green New Deal](#) is estimated to cost Americans \$93 trillion over 10 years.
- ➔ As taxes have risen around the country, some states have suffered population loss while states with lower taxes have seen population increases.



Socialism Gains Strong Momentum Among Gen Z

In 2023, a [Fraiser Institute](#) poll indicated that 45% of Americans aged 18-24 agree that socialism is the ideal economic system for the U.S.

Going along with the increase in socialist political support, socialist political candidates have increased at every level of elected government. The Democratic Socialists of America identify having 200 elected officials “spanning every level of government,” including electing socialists to Congress, State Assemblies, Mayoral positions and City Councils.

BREAKDOWN OF ARRESTS BY ICE IN CALIFORNIA

In June 2025, ICE arrested 2,031 people in Southern California. According to ICE, 32 percent of the arrestees had prior criminal convictions, and an additional 11 percent faced pending charges. These include minor or non-violent offenses.

California ICE Arrests June 2025:

- [ICE](#) arrested Cuong Chanh Phan, a 49-year-old illegal alien from Vietnam. He was convicted for second degree murder and was sentenced to 15 years to life.
- [ICE](#) arrested Rolando Veneracion-Enriquez, a 55-year-old illegal alien from Philippines. His criminal history includes sexual penetration with a foreign object with force and assault with intent to commit rape and burglary.
- [ICE](#) arrested Lionel Sanchez-Laguna, a 55-year-old illegal alien from Mexico. His criminal history includes assault with a semi-automatic firearm, discharging a firearm at an inhabited dwelling and vehicle, willful cruelty to a child, and driving under the influence.
- [ICE](#) arrested Jose Gregorio Medranda Ortiz, a 42-year-old illegal alien from Ecuador. His criminal history includes conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute five kilograms or more cocaine while on board a vessel.



Criminal Alien vs. Non-Criminal Alien

ICE classifies anyone with a prior conviction or criminal charge as a “criminal alien.” An immigration violator with no convictions or charges is considered a “non-criminal alien.” ICE has the authority to arrest immigrants who are suspected of violating immigration laws, regardless of criminal history.

ICE has arrested a large number of illegal aliens who have been convicted of violent crimes and drug offenses.

WHO ARE THE DEMOCRATIC SOCIALISTS OF AMERICA?

DSA has supported numerous candidates over the past several years, including Senator Bernie Sanders in his 2016 and 2020 Presidential campaigns, Zohran Mamdani's campaign for Mayor of New York City, and Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez and Rashida Tlaib's campaigns for the United States House of Representatives.

Did You Know?

- ➔ According to [their 2023 constitution](#), the DSA rejects an economic order based on private profit and supports socialist economic efforts as a replacement.
- ➔ Metro DC DSA members have [identified](#) knocking on more than 150,000 doors and made over 61,000 phonebank calls to voters since their electoral program was relaunched in 2017.
- ➔ In November 2023, DSA members [participated in a protest](#) at the Democratic National Committee calling for a ceasefire in Gaza, which led to a clash with law enforcement injuring 90 protestors and 6 police officers.
- ➔ In July 2024, the DSA [removed its endorsement](#) of Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez after she hosted an online panel discussion about antisemitism with Jewish leaders, calling her comments “a deep betrayal.”



NYC's Top Democrat

Zohran Mamdani, who won the 2025 Democratic nomination for Mayor of New York City, identifies as a Democratic Socialist and was endorsed by the DSA. Mamdani has expressed support for making city buses fare-free, providing public child care, raising the minimum wage to \$30 an hour by 2030, and creating city-owned grocery stores that buy and sell at wholesale prices. In addition, Mamdani says he would pay for his plans by raising the corporate tax rate and taxing New Yorkers who earn more than \$1 million annually at a flat 2 percent rate.

Who is funding the anti-ICE activists in LA?

KNOWN ORGANIZERS & FUNDERS OF NATIONWIDE PROTESTS

On June 6, 2025, ICE began making arrests of suspected illegal immigrants. Large-scale protests quickly developed and turned into riots where hundreds of rioters clashed with police. Hundreds of people were at the federal detention center, where they vandalized the building and hurled chairs, rocks, and other objects at officers.

Did You Know?

- ➔ The Coalition for Humane Immigrant Rights of Los Angeles (CHIRLA) was one of the activist organizations at the center of the Los Angeles protests. CHIRLA has received millions in taxpayer dollars through government grants.
- ➔ David Huerta, the head of SEIU California, was arrested after sitting in front of a vehicle gate and encouraging protesters to help “stop the vehicles.” The union organized rallies in multiple cities in response to Huerta’s arrest.
- ➔ The Party for Socialism and Liberation, a group with documented ties to the Chinese Communist Party, is at the forefront of protesting ICE. The group is organizing protests across the country and has encouraged the intimidation of federal agents.
- ➔ A nonprofit called Operation Healthy Hearts assembled and distributed packs that included goggles, facemasks, gloves, and a phone number for “jail support.” The packs were labeled “Fuck ICE PPE Kits.”



Mayor Bass Admits “Significant” Violence and Vandalism in Los Angeles

Los Angeles County Sheriff deputies were attacked with broken cinder blocks, rocks, bottles, and pepper spray.

Law enforcement officials noted that the second day of the protests and rioting were more organized with caravans of cars arriving and that people came in masks, dressed in black, and with some bringing materials to break concrete barriers that were then thrown at police officers.

2 Chinese nationals charged with smuggling 'potential agroterrorism' fungus into US: DOJ

EXPLORING THE UPTICK IN INFILTRATION AND ESPIONAGE EFFORTS BY CHINESE CITIZENS & COMPANIES

In the past year, and specifically the past few months, there has been a pattern of attempted espionage efforts by Chinese nationals and companies throughout the U.S. – and specifically on university campuses.

Did You Know?

- In June 2025, a Chinese couple, Yunqing Jian and Zunyong Liu, were charged with [conspiracy and smuggling a dangerous biological pathogen](#) into the U.S. for their work at a University of Michigan laboratory.
- In May 2025, the [Stanford Review published](#) a “bombshell report” that shed light on the influence of spies from the Chinese Communist Party, alleging they have likely infiltrated Stanford and other universities nationwide to gather intelligence.
- In May 2025, U.S. energy officials [identified unauthorized communication devices](#), sometimes referred to as “kill switches,” embedded in Chinese-manufactured solar inverters.
- Chinese entities own land in close proximity to [19 U.S. military bases](#) across the country. [80% of Chinese owned land](#) in the United States is held by one company and another billionaire.



CCP Operatives Attempting to Recruit Students for Espionage Activities

A 2025 Stanford Review investigation also uncovered attempts by suspected CCP operatives to recruit U.S. students researching sensitive China-related topics. In a previous incident in 2024, the FBI charged five Chinese nationals who studied at the University of Michigan with espionage related charges after they were accused of taking photos of military equipment at Camp Grayling.

PULSE CHECK ON THE AMERICAN ECONOMY

The overall sentiment of the U.S. economy is mixed, with people under 30 feeling worse about their financial situation. Despite polling showing a negative sentiment for the national economy, more people rate their personal finances as “excellent or good” than “poor.”

Did You Know?

- Inflation has not been this low since March 2021. Headline inflation tracks key metrics of consumer spending like food, housing, and transportation to reflect the actual cost of living.
- Consumers are currently paying an average of \$3.19 per gallon of gasoline, continuing a downward trend. In May 2024, the average cost of a gallon of gasoline was \$3.61.
- In the fourth quarter of 2022, the median sales price of a house rose a record high of \$442,600. In the first quarter of 2025, the median sales price was \$416,900.
- At the end of 2024, 4.8% of outstanding auto debt was at least 90 days late. The average car payment for a new vehicle is \$742 a month and used car payments are \$525 a month.



Overall Sentiment

According to a May 2025 poll by Napolitan News Service, 38% of Americans rate their personal finances as “excellent or good” compared to 22% who rate theirs as “poor.” 48% of people think the economy is getting worse and only 31% think the economy is getting better.

DEBUNKING FALSE MEDICAID CLAIMS & EXAMINING TRUMP'S EXECUTIVE ORDER ON LOWERING PRESCRIPTION DRUG PRICES

On May 12, 2025, President Trump signed a sweeping executive order with the aim to lower pharmaceutical drug prices for Americans and reduce price disparities with other developed countries.

Key takeaways from President Trump's executive order on prescription drug prices:

- Implementing a [“most-favored-nation” pricing model](#) tying the price the US pays for medications to lower prices paid by other nations
- Ending [unfair practices](#) that force Americans to bear disproportionate burdens
- Establishing [programs and mechanisms](#) that enable direct-to-consumer sales to American patients

Falsehoods spread by Democrats and mainstream media:

- Despite claims from media outlets and Democrat politicians, the GOP budget plan only reduces Medicaid payments to fraudsters, illegal immigrants, able-bodied adults who don't work 80 hours per month, and those with incomes above the federal poverty line.
- Democrats and left-leaning organizations have inundated news releases and social media posts with the claim that 13.7 million Americans would be uninsured, an exaggeration millions higher than estimates from the Congressional Budget Office.



Americans pay significantly more for prescription medications than other consumers; for instance, the weight-loss drug Ozempic costs 10 times more in the US compared to the rest of the developed world.

THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION IS HOLDING UNIVERSITIES ACCOUNTABLE FOR ALLOWING ANTISEMITISM ON CAMPUS

The Trump administration has taken a number of actions to hold universities accountable for allowing antisemitism on campus, including issuing an executive order, launching investigations, and withholding federal grants.

Did you know...?

- 60 universities are presently under investigation for Title VI violations related to antisemitic harassment and discrimination.
- In April 2025, the administration froze \$2.3 billion in funding for Harvard following a review that began in March of the overall \$9 billion in federal funding the university receives. On April 21, 2025, Harvard University sued to block the funds from being frozen. The administration's rationale was to combat Harvard's antisemitism and ideological bias.
- Several other elite colleges have had federal grants and contracts withheld, including Cornell University (\$1 billion), Northwestern University (\$790 million), Brown University (\$510 million), Columbia University (\$400 million), Princeton University (\$210 million), and University of Pennsylvania (\$175 million).



On January 29, 2025, President Trump issued an executive order entitled “Additional Measures to Combat Anti-Semitism,” which ordered an inventory of all pending administrative complaints against or involving institutions of higher education alleging civil-rights violations related to or arising from post-October 7, 2023, campus antisemitism.



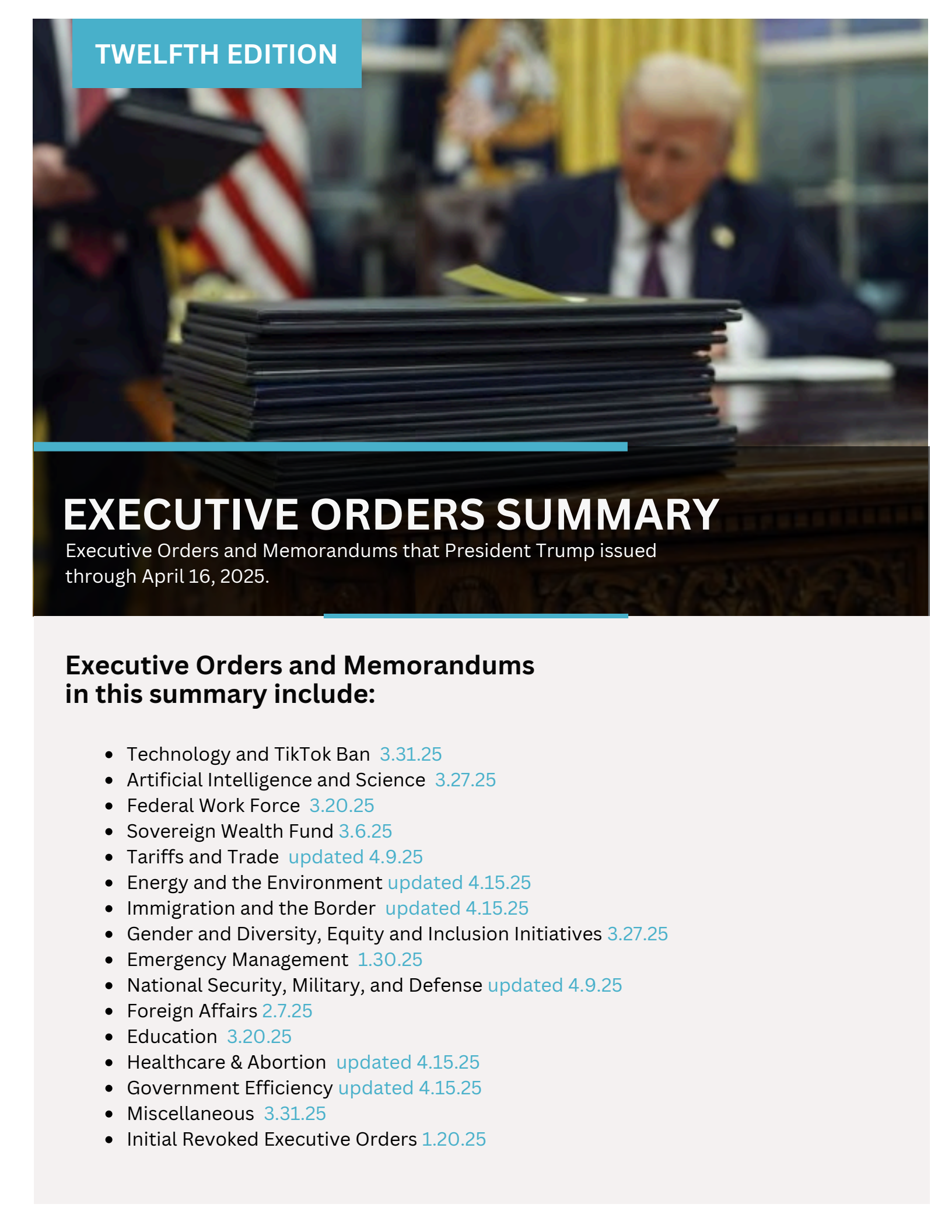

THE TRUMP TARIFFS ARE DESIGNED TO RESHAPE THE GLOBAL ECONOMY

President Trump, a longtime supporter of tariffs, is following through on his promise from the campaign trail in an effort to “reorder the global economy” in favor of the American worker.

Did you know...?

- The Trump tariffs will run as high as 104% on some countries, with the largest rates hitting smaller economies that trade with the U.S. Most recently, the President has [issued](#) a 90-day pause on tariffs for all countries but China.
- Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent has [said](#) that he is fielding “a massive number of requests for negotiations” and that “up to” 70 countries have already reached out to the White House for a seat at the negotiating table.
- Tariffs under Trump have worked in the past. Trump successfully used the [threat](#) of tariffs in 2019 to pressure Mexico to stem the flow of migrants to the U.S. border. American steel and aluminum have [“welcomed”](#) tariffs, saying they are “effective” at spurring more investment in the U.S. The American shrimping industry is [“optimistic”](#) as they struggle to compete with cheaper, imported shrimp.

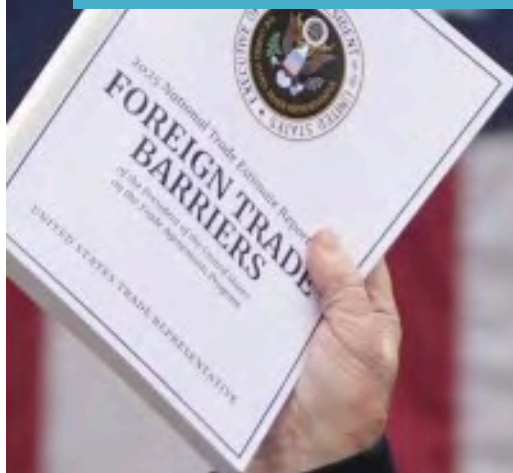


Tariffs have incentivized numerous companies to commit hundreds of billions of dollars in U.S. investment

Trump’s top trade official, Jamieson Greer, [praised](#) tariffs as having a positive impact as companies have [announced](#) investments in the U.S.

Pharmaceutical companies Johnson & Johnson and Eli Lilly have announced \$77 billion in investments, tech giant Apple has promised \$500 billion in manufacturing and training, and Nvidia is investing “several hundred billion” in electronics manufacturing in the U.S.

MAKING AMERICA SAFE AGAIN

During his campaign, President Trump promised to implement stronger immigration crackdowns on illegal aliens – and his administration is keeping its word to the American people. More than 32,000 arrests were made in the first 50 days of his administration, and 70% of those detained were either charged with or found guilty of a variety of crimes.

Did you know...?

- As of March 23, federal data shows 47,892 detentions of illegal migrants, the most since Trump's first term. According to the New York Post on March 21, 2025, roughly 250 alleged migrant gang members had already been deported to El Salvador prisons.
- Under Trump there have been numerous large-scale roundups of illegal migrants who have been charged or convicted of various violent crimes notably in Texas, Alabama, New Mexico, Virginia, Kentucky, Massachusetts and Georgia.
- ICE has apprehended illegal migrants who have committed violent crimes including crimes against children, homicide, sex crimes, weapons charges and drug trafficking.



“Known” Gangbangers in the U.S. Illegally are Being Apprehended and Deported

In March 2025, a FBI immigration taskforce arrested an MS-13 gang leader in Northern Virginia. Henry Josue Villatoro Santos, an illegal migrant, was booked on weapons charges and was one of 340 illegal migrant criminals nabbed by the taskforce in March. According to Attorney General Pam Bondi, Santos was one of MS-13's top leaders, “heading up all MS-13 violent crimes on the East Coast.”

THE TAX CUTS AND JOBS ACT

On December 22, 2017, President Trump signed into law the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act. A number of these provisions were temporary and set to expire in 2026, including the lower individual tax rates, the higher standard deduction, the child tax credit, the higher estate tax exclusion, and the SALT cap. If the provisions set to expire in the TCJA aren't extended, there would be an effective \$4 trillion in tax increases.

Did you know...?

- The TCJA was the largest tax code overhaul in nearly three decades and was meant to grow the economy and reduce the complexity of the tax code.
- The TCJA nearly doubled the standard deduction for both single and joint filers when it went into effect in 2018. If The TCJA isn't renewed, individual filers would see a rise in their income tax rates, have a lower standard deduction, and lose the Child Tax Credit.
- Those that argue against the extending the TCJA would decrease revenue by \$4 trillion between 2025-2034. If changes aren't made to spending, this would increase the deficit by \$4 trillion.

SCOTUS RULING ON FOREIGN AID

In March 2025, The Supreme Court Voted 5-4 To Reject The Trump Administration's Emergency Appeal To Judge Ali's Ruling. "A sharply divided Supreme Court on Wednesday rejected the Trump administration's bid to freeze nearly \$2 billion in foreign aid, but it was not clear how quickly money might start flowing.

Background

- On February 13, 2025, U.S. District Judge Amir Ali ordered the Trump Administration to temporarily lift the funding freeze on U.S. foreign aid in a lawsuit brought by two organizations, the AIDS Vaccine Advocacy Coalition and the Global Health Council, representing health organizations receiving U.S. funds for work abroad.
- The judge ruled that the administration had not "offered any explanation for why a blanket suspension of all congressional appropriated foreign aid, which set off a shockwave ... was a national precursor to reviewing programs."
- The Trump Administration had argued that the situation had changed because it had replaced the blanket spending freeze with individualized determinations, which led to the cancellation of contracts totaling nearly \$60 billion.



The 5-4 majority had Chief Justice John Roberts and Justice Amy Coney Barrett join the three liberal justices to form a majority. Justice Alito wrote the dissent and was joined by Justices Thomas, Gorsuch, and Kavanaugh.

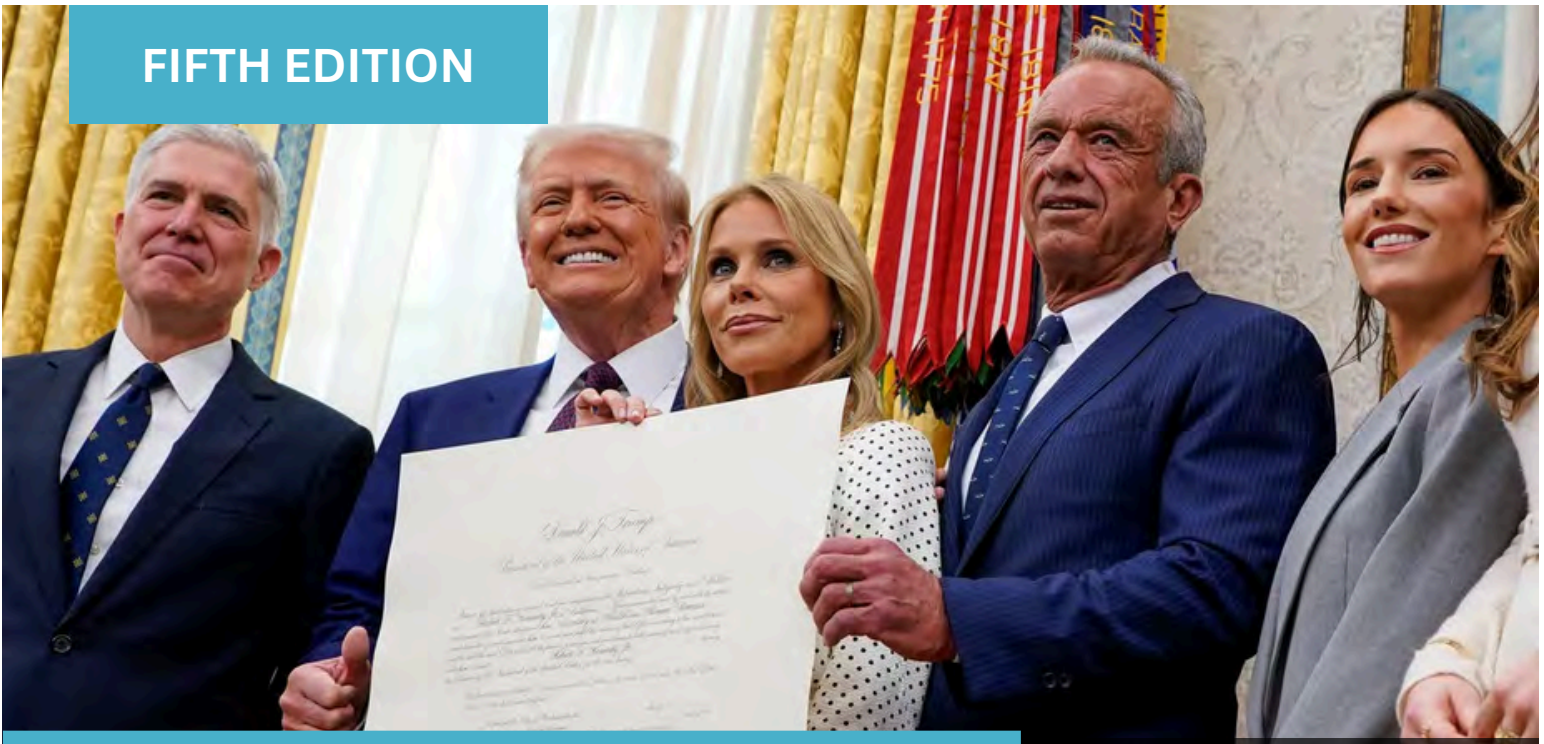

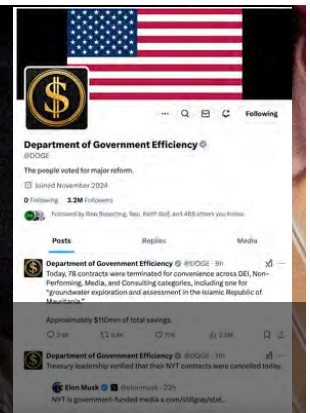

THE DECONSTRUCTION OF DEI IN AMERICA

Donald Trump's decisive victory over Kamala Harris in November has led to America's biggest brands and universities scrapping or dramatically altering their DEI programs. The decision to move on from DEI initiatives in business "reflects a majority view among Americans" that "workers' support of corporate diversity efforts has softened."

Did you know...?

- Trump's dismantling efforts are currently underway following his Day 1 executive order putting an end to Biden-era programs in the federal government and place those staff on leave. The impact is already being felt. The Departments of Agriculture, Treasury and Labor have removed their DEI webpages, and the FCC has terminated its plan to promote DEI. - Numerous high-profile companies have drastically curbed or scrapped DEI initiatives in their workplace. These companies include Amazon, Boeing, Brown-Forman (owner of Jack Daniels), Caterpillar, Ford, Harley-Davidson, John Deere, Lowe's, Molson Coors, McDonalds, Meta, Nissan, Stanley Black & Decker, Tractor Supply, Toyota and Wal Mart.
- According to the Associated Press, "dozens" of DEI programs have closed in states that include Alabama, Florida, Kentucky, Missouri, North Carolina, Iowa, Nebraska and Texas. Additionally, "lessons about racial and gender identity have been phased out."



In July 2024, CNN "quietly disbanded" its "Race and Equality" team in what was reported a major restructuring. According to the New York Post, a CNN spokesman said "for all intents and purposes, the team is not a team anymore," adding that they were reassigned to different areas.

PRESIDENT TRUMP IS FOCUSED ON NATIONAL SECURITY TO PROTECT AMERICANS FROM HOMEGROWN AND FOREIGN TERRORISTS

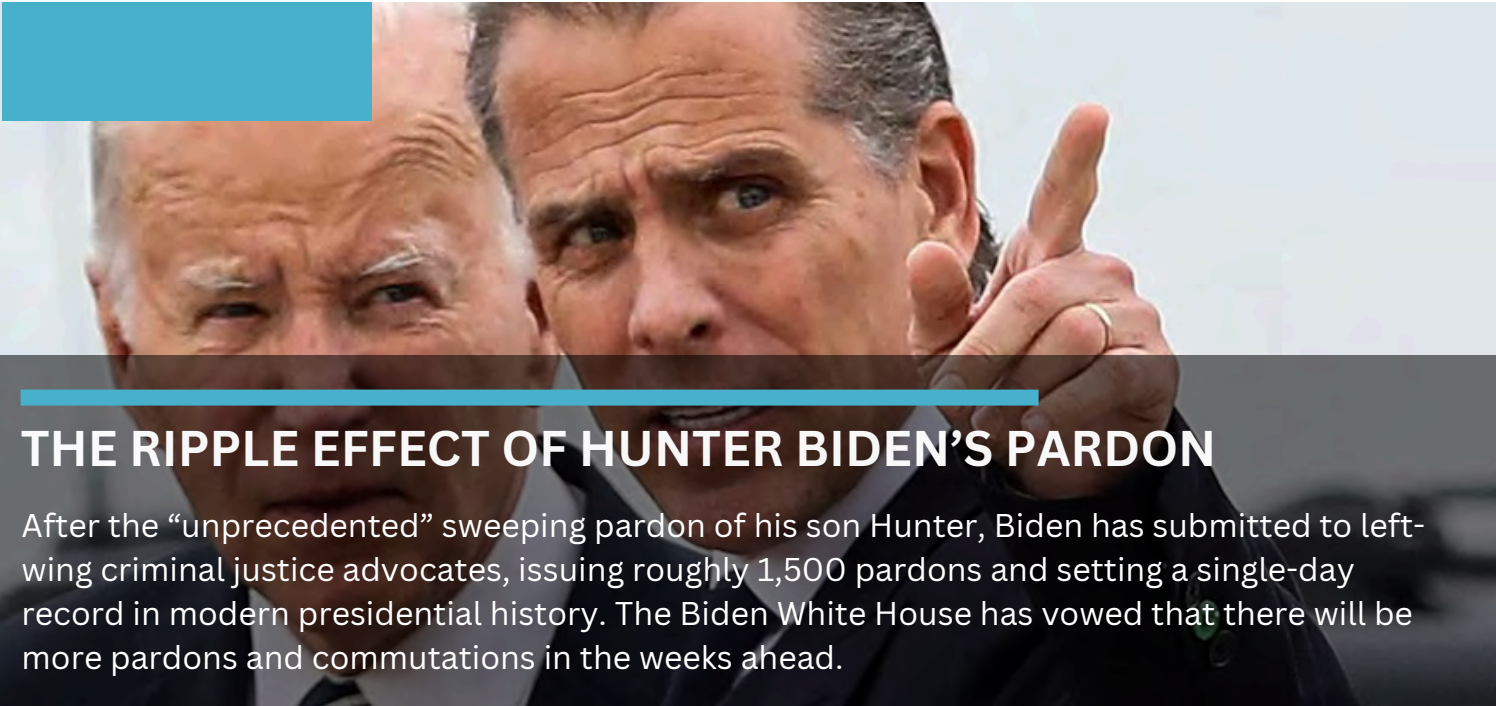
The most recent attack in New Orleans, killing 14 people, was a grim reminder that domestic terrorism continues to be a threat to the safety of all Americans. The threat is growing, as FBI officials have disclosed that investigations of suspected domestic violent extremists have “more than doubled” since spring 2020.

Did you know...?

- Kash Patel, Trump’s FBI director nominee, who if confirmed by the U.S. Senate, will take the lead investigating domestic terrorism such as the recent attacks in New Orleans and Las Vegas. It has been disclosed that Patel is **advocating** for “better intel-sharing” across the nation’s law enforcement agencies while maintaining spy powers to keep the country safe.
- During the Biden administration, the FBI **made** “controversial decisions” when it directed officers to address parents at school board meetings and warned that there are potential Catholic extremists. Additionally, the FBI has been criticized for its heightened focus on DEI (diversity, equity, and inclusion), a proponent of the Left’s “woke” agenda, and its prosecution of Trump.
- Christopher Costa, senior director for counterterrorism at the White House National Security Council in the first Trump administration, **said**, “I have never seen the threat landscape this worrying, not just from a counterterrorism perspective but from state-sponsored threats.”



Trump’s plans to tackle domestic terrorism is likely to expand to not only prioritize Islamist terrorist groups, designating cartels as terrorist organizations and focus on illegal crossings at the southern border. In June 2024, 8 people on the terrorist watchlist were apprehended. **Data** from the Department of Homeland Security found that 169 people on the watchlist were apprehended in 2023.



THE RIPPLE EFFECT OF HUNTER BIDEN'S PARDON

After the “unprecedented” sweeping pardon of his son Hunter, Biden has submitted to left-wing criminal justice advocates, issuing roughly 1,500 pardons and setting a single-day record in modern presidential history. The Biden White House has vowed that there will be more pardons and commutations in the weeks ahead.

- According to a recent **poll** by Napolitan News Service, 62 percent of voters oppose Biden's pardoning of his son, with 41 percent who strongly oppose. Additionally, a majority, or 54 percent, disagree with Biden's statement that Hunter Biden was unfairly targeted for political purposes.
- Biden's 1,499 pardons **marked** the most pardons issued in a single day. Before his sweeping announcement, he had already commuted 135 sentences. This is compared to Trump's first term when he pardoned 144 and commuted 94 sentences.
- According to the **Pew Research Center**, Biden is **following** in the footsteps of Obama, who gave a reprieve to 1,927 individuals during his two terms as president. This marked the highest total of any modern president since former President Harry Truman.



Unlike Hunter Biden's legal issues, Trump's crimes were “relatively minor” misdemeanors that were elevated to felonies by progressive **DA Alvin Bragg**. Bragg's case against Trump rested on **shaky** legal ground and set a “**bad political precedent**.”

Rep. Dean Phillips (D-MN) has **called** on New York Gov Kathy Hochul to pardon Trump. Rep. Jim Clyburn (D-SC) has **said** Biden should issue a Trump pardon. He joins Sen. Fetterman in **advocating** for a Trump pardon.

Trump made substantial gains amongst demographics that don't usually vote Republican. 1 in 3 voters of color supported Trump this election, likely besting George W. Bush in 2004. He received a **higher level of support from Black voters** than any Republican presidential candidate in 42 years.

- The Edison Research exit poll found he was backed by **46%** of Latino voters, and Latino men **backed** Trump by more than any Republican in a Presidential election.

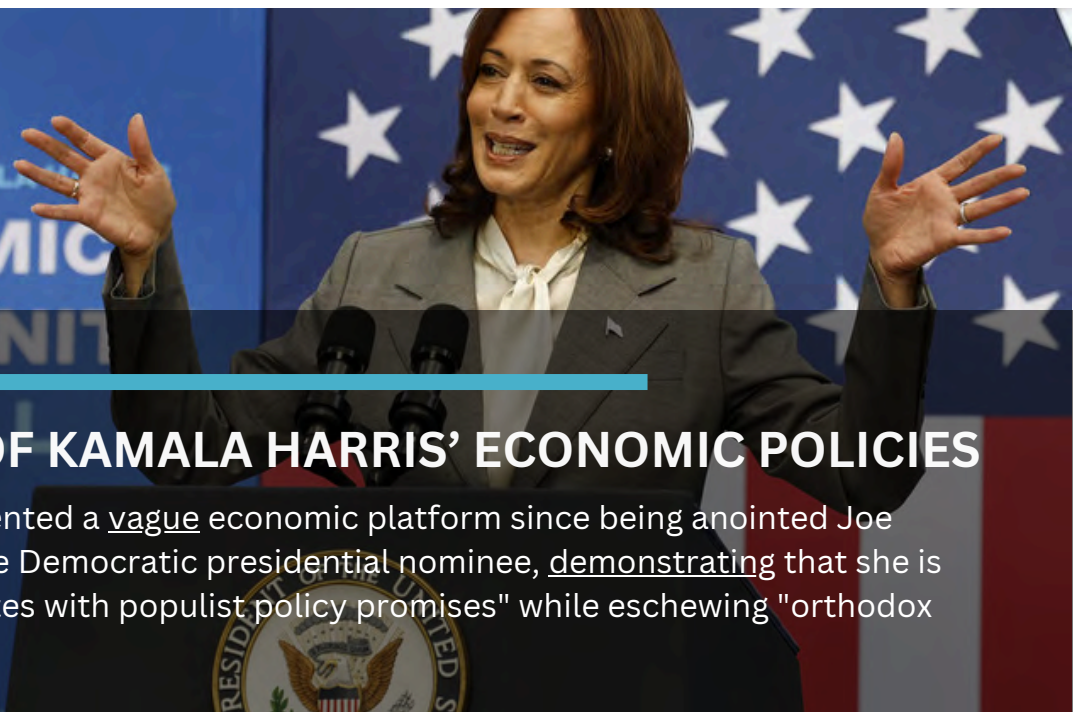

She has also endorsed numerous tax increases that **would** raise costs on families, hamper economic growth, and reduce America's competitiveness with the rest of the world.

EXAMPLES OF IRS OVERREACH

The Internal Revenue Service has a long history of overreaching under multiple administrations. Under Biden-Harris, we see the IRS expanding its efforts to target middle-class Americans using new resources in the Inflation Reduction Act and improper use of AI and technology.

Did you know...?

- The Inflation Reduction Act – passed in August 2022 – **included \$80 billion in funding for the IRS over 10 years** and could allow the IRS to hire almost 87,000 new full-time agents. Reports show that 78% to 90% of the money raised from under-reported income would likely come from those making less than \$200,000 a year.
- In 2021, the CBO projected that increased spending on the IRS's enforcement activities due to the Biden-Harris Inflation Reduction Act would result in **higher audit rates**.
- In response to a September 2023 announcement that the **Biden-Harris IRS will start using AI for auditing purposes**, the House Judiciary Committee is investigating the potential for abuse brought by unwieldy technology use.
- Even though the Biden-Harris Administration seeks to empower the IRS to go after billionaires, that's not necessarily how the agency has operated. **Instead, it has targeted middle and working-class Americans.**



“According to an audit by the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration released in March, 63% of audits last year involved taxpayers earning less than \$200,000 a year. This is slightly different than how the Biden-Harris administration sold it.”

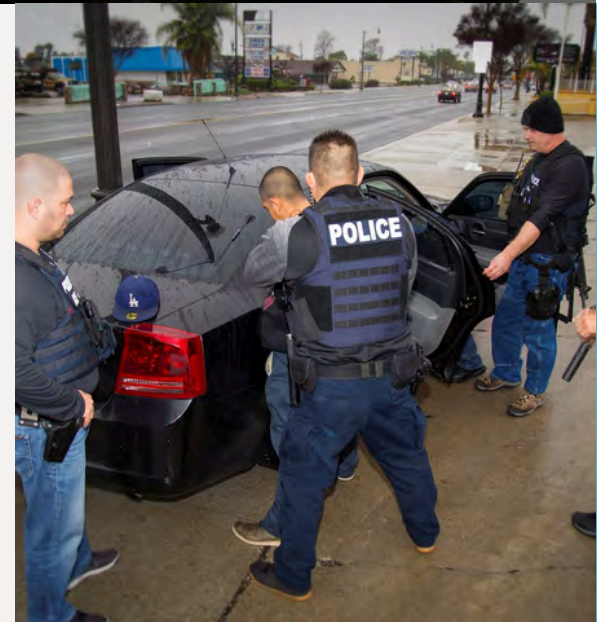

THEN VS. NOW: CRIME HAS RISEN IN AMERICA COMPARED TO JUST FOUR YEARS AGO

Under the Biden and Harris administration, there has been a measurable increase in crime nationwide. The Bureau of Justice reports a 37 percent increase in violent crime, a stark contrast to the 17 percent decrease in violent crime during the Trump administration.

In Alexandria, Virginia, crime has come to the forefront for local business owners who say it's affecting their operations and threatening their safety. In San Francisco, Bayside Market, recently shut its doors after 35 years due to crime. Businesses in Chicago and Washington, DC are being burglarized and vandalized. In Kansas City, a business owner said his customers and employees don't feel safe.

BY THE NUMBERS: THE BIDEN-HARRIS ADMINISTRATION HAS EXACERBATED THE BORDER CRISIS

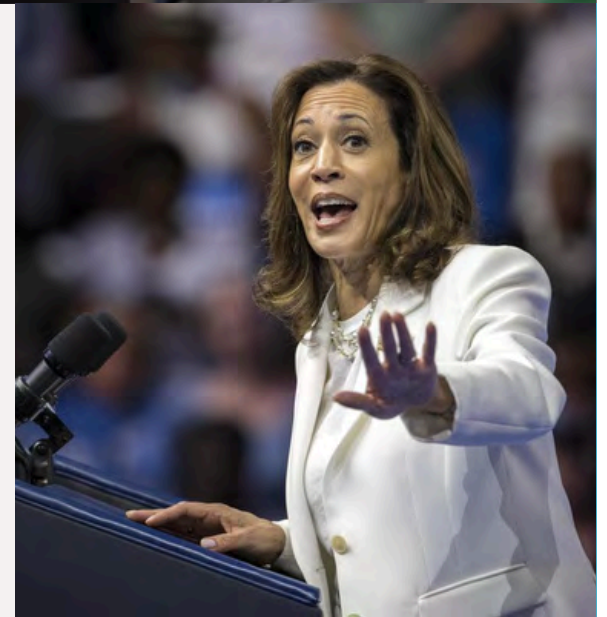

Students for Justice in Palestine has been on U.S. campuses for decades, with frequent protests urging the liberation of Palestinians and boycotts against Israel. The loosely connected network, known as SJP, says it has more than 200 chapters across the U.S. and Canada.

SJP has had a vocal presence at Columbia University in recent days and at one point said it had walked away from talks with school leaders until administrators pledge not to have them arrested or forcefully removed from their encampment on the Ivy League institution's West Lawn.

PAST IS PROLOGUE: THE FAILURES OF JOE BIDEN'S IRAN POLICY

The federal government spends \$1.7 billion annually to maintain 770,000 empty buildings.

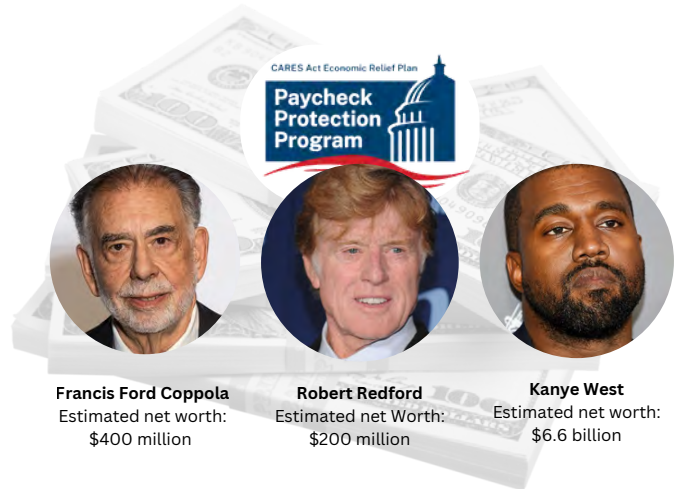
- The government maintains these empty buildings as agencies lease or buy new space.
- The Government Accountability Office claimed the government holds more property than it needs and uses unreliable data for property management decisions.



2

During the pandemic, multimillionaire celebrities cashed in on the federal government's Paycheck Protection Program.

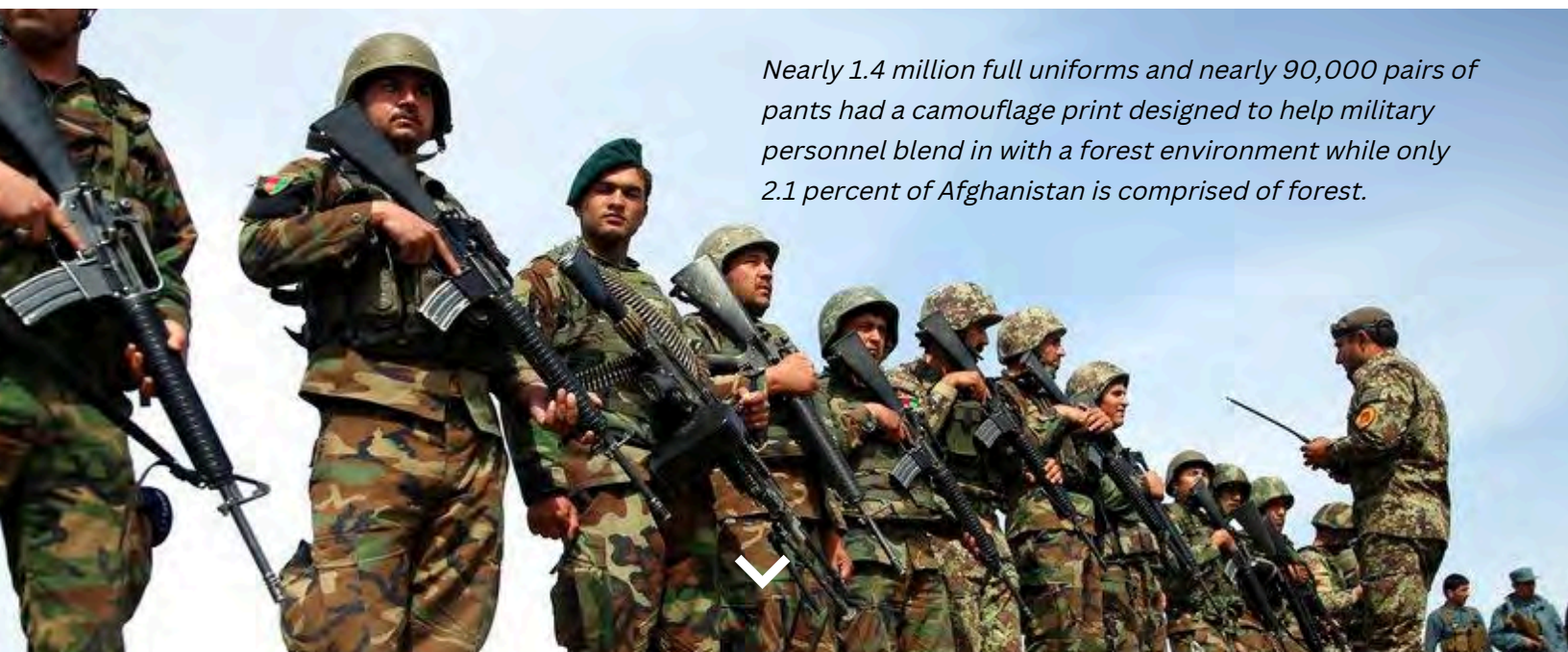
- Kanye West, Robert Redford and Francis Ford Coppola received millions in funds from the program. West's Yeezy, LLC received \$2.4 million despite him having a net worth of \$6.6 billion. Redford's Sundance Institute received \$3.04 million and two of Coppola's companies received a combined \$8.5 million.



3

The federal government has spent at least \$28 million on camouflage uniforms for the Afghan National Army that didn't blend in with the country's surroundings.

- The camouflage pattern was owned by a Canadian company. An inspector general found that the Pentagon could have used other patterns owned by the U.S. armed forces and would have saved up to \$72.2 million over 10 years.



Nearly 1.4 million full uniforms and nearly 90,000 pairs of pants had a camouflage print designed to help military personnel blend in with a forest environment while only 2.1 percent of Afghanistan is comprised of forest.

President Biden's \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan delivered \$350 billion to state and local governments to spend however they wanted, with hundreds of thousands of dollars spent on things like attracting social media influencers and bloggers to a town in Massachusetts.

- Numerous projects spent with American Rescue Plan dollars echoed “pork-barrel spending disasters” like Alaska’s \$398 million “Bridge to Nowhere.”
- Social-media influencers received a chunk of \$7 million to tout Alaskan seafood and Pittsfield, Massachusetts spent \$510,000 to hire a public relations firm to woo influencers and bloggers to the town.
- Millions of taxpayer dollars were used to upgrade golf courses and ski resorts. Colorado Springs spent \$6.6 million to replace golf course irrigation systems; upscale Palm Beach Gardens, Florida spent \$2 million to build a new golf course. Dutchess County, New York pledged \$12 million to renovate its minor league baseball stadium; North Carolina spent \$40 million to upgrade racetracks; New Jersey spent \$15 million to boost its bid for the 2026 World Cup; Birmingham, Alabama spent \$5 million to support the 2022 World Games.
- Arizona used \$7.2 million of taxpayer dollars to boost its horse racing prize purses.

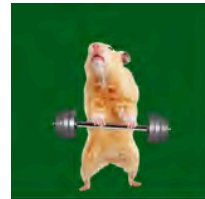

- Its report found \$240 million for the upgrading of M1 Abrams tanks that the Pentagon opposed.
- The report also highlighted \$650,000 for feral swine management; \$500,000 for preserving a historic ski jump.

In 2020, thousands of millionaires received unemployment checks, including unemployment benefits.

- According to the IRS, over 19,000 people earning at least \$1 million collected unemployment benefits in 2020. The data also found that 4,500 people earning between \$5 million and \$10 million and 229 people earning eight figures received benefits.
- “Millionaires received an average of \$13,900 in benefits.”
- Millionaires received a total of \$264 million in unemployment benefits.

In 2010, the U.S. Census Bureau spent \$2.5 million on an ad that ran during the Super Bowl.

- The spending on the Super Bowl ad was roundly criticized by lawmakers.

According to a Forbes 2020 waste report, numerous egregious examples of government waste were found.

- According to the report, the Las Vegas-based nonprofit Hookers for Jesus received \$530,190, Libraries Without borders received \$242,800 for its “Wash and Learn” initiative to enhance story time in laundromats, and \$2.1 million was granted to the Family Guidance Association of Ethiopia to educate Ethiopian prostitutes on sex education.
- Their report also found that the prestigious Ivy League Universities received \$9.8 billion in taxpayer-funded grants from 2017 to 2019, despite those schools having a collective endowment of \$140 billion.

In 2009, President Obama appointed then-Vice President Biden to oversee the implementation of the stimulus package. The CBO found the stimulus added \$840 billion to the national debt and had no lasting effects on employment.

- As a candidate for President, Biden has said he managed “every single penny” of the 2009 stimulus.
- Biden has touted stimulus backed projects that ripped-off American taxpayers. These projects included Cree, Solyndra, and Fisker automotive. In 2010, he touted stimulus money provided to Cree, a green manufacturer building factories in China. In 2009, he touted a \$535 million loan to Solyndra that fleeced taxpayers at least \$511 million. He also touted Fisker Automotive, which resulted in a taxpayer loss of \$139 million.
- Under Biden, the stimulus directly benefitted numerous high-profile campaign bundlers. According to iWatch News, these bundlers stood to profit from stimulus money, government contracts and other spending related to clean energy. Steve Westly, a California bundler for Obama held stake in at least five companies that won more than half a billion dollars in stimulus funding. Steven Spinner, another Obama bundler, consulted on alternative energy loans while his wife’s law firm raked in millions from represented companies that applied of loans. Another bundler, Donald Gips’ company, Level 3 Communications, received \$13.8 in stimulus funds. Lastly, the stimulus delivered \$200 million to Exelon, of which a company board member and the leader of its legal and lobbying team were bundlers.

Claims Versus Facts on Data Centers

Executive Summary

Data center operation and construction have seen explosive growth with more than 4,000 facilities already operating across the country and roughly 3,000 more planned or under construction. The four largest tech companies alone spent an estimated \$360 billion on data center development in 2025.

This growth has received backlash and caused data centers to become the most divisive infrastructure issue in America. Public sentiment has shifted sharply: a 2026 Gallup survey found 70% of Americans oppose having a data center built in their community, a number that cuts across party lines, with Republican Governor Greg Abbott in Texas and Democratic Governor Kathy Hochul in New York alike moving to restrict new development.

Much of the opposition to data centers is based on false, misleading claims or outright disinformation campaigns that is partly fueled by Chinese bot farms posting on U.S. social media, and public activity from the same network financed by Beijing-based tech tycoon Neville Roy Singham.

Benefits to Local Communities

CLAIM:

- Average people aren't receiving any benefits from data centers.

FACTS:

- In July 2026, Georgia Tech Scheller College of Business [found](#) employment up ~3.5%, wages up ~5%, business establishments up ~5%, and household income up ~2% in areas where data centers were constructed.
- According to the Brookings Institute, labor markets [receiving](#) their first large data center see employment in data processing rise 56% over the first decade, and telecoms +43% in hyperscale counties. That typically translates to 100–200 direct jobs per facility at the county level.
- In December 2024, an analysis was [conducted](#) of the Rowan Digital Infrastructure Project in Frederick County, Maryland which found the project supported 15,500+ jobs, \$1B+ in labor income, and \$2.2B+ in statewide economic activity during the construction phase alone.

CLAIM:

- Local communities aren't receiving any benefits from data centers.

FACTS:

- In 2006, Microsoft [broke](#) ground on 75 acres of bean fields near Quincy, Washington. By 2026, 30 data centers shoulder an estimated 57% of Quincy's property taxes. Using the funds [produced](#) by the data centers, Quincy funded a \$120M new high school, a \$15M aquatic center (with waterslides and lazy river), a new police station, fire station, city hall, hospital, and library. Additionally, Microsoft

[partnered](#) with the city on a \$30M water reuse facility that benefits the entire local industrial base, not just the data center.

- In February 2025, an analysis of data center investment in Abilene, TX [found](#) that a large AI data center generates substantial construction-phase employment for pipefitters, electricians, ironworkers, and concrete workers — trade jobs that don't require tech-sector credentials. The City of Abilene was projected to benefit from \$7.3M in county construction-phase tax revenues and \$57M+ in state-level tax revenues primarily through augmented sales tax receipts.
- In August 2026, Loudoun County, VA [identified](#) 250 data centers generating a projected \$1.3 billion in FY2027 tax revenue, accounting for ~40% of the county's total budget. As a result of this investment, residential property taxes were cut by ~30% over the past decade (from \$1.145 per \$100 assessed value). For every \$1 Loudoun County [spends](#) providing services to data centers, it receives \$26 in local tax revenue
- In Cheyenne, Wyoming, 21 data center facilities are [already](#) operational, with Microsoft purchasing ~3,200 additional acres, and Meta is building an \$800M campus south of the city. Largely [related](#) to data center construction, building permit fee revenues are up 31% and electricity franchise revenues up 48% in 2025 alone.
- In Cedar Rapids, IA, QTS joined a deal to [invest](#) a minimum of \$750M investment plus an \$18M Community Betterment Fund over 20 years to support data center construction.
- Meta has [announced](#) a \$27B Hyperion project on 2,250 acres of former Louisiana farmland, generating construction activity at massive scale with thousands of workers in hardhats, 24/7 truck traffic, and rapid housing demand. It is [reported](#) as a once-in-a-generation investment for a region with persistent poverty, job loss, and population decline.
- In Hancock County, Kentucky, TeraWulf is [proposing](#) a hyperscale campus at the former Hawesville aluminum smelter — a community that already has heavy industrial power infrastructure and a workforce accustomed to large-facility operations. Kentucky modeling suggests a \$4B, 400MW facility could generate \$290–\$435M in local tax revenue over 12 years, including up to \$222M for local school districts.

Job Creation

CLAIM:

- Data centers don't drive meaningful job creation.

FACTS:

- Data center projects are offering skilled trade workers some of the [highest pay and bonuses the industry has ever seen](#).
- Tech companies are spending hundreds of millions of dollars [funding 270 training facilities in partnership with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers](#). For example, Google has a \$50

million program to boost annual apprenticeship enrollment from 19,500 to 30,000 over the next three years.

- Meta has allocated [\\$115 million a year to train construction workers](#), starting with 5,000, in partnership with the Associated Builders and Contractors trade association.
- In 2018, Microsoft started programs for data center technicians that have [trained 15,000 people across 39 locations](#).
- Unions are broadly in support of data centers. A spokesman who I.B.E.W. Local 26, which represented electrical workers in the D.C. area, wrote that [data centers “are the best opportunity in generations for blue-collar workers to attain a portion of the American dream.”](#) He noted that in the D.C. region, his union was able to bring in 600 new apprentices last year alone and that these are high paying jobs.
- A report from the Northern Virginia Technology Council highlighted that in 2025, [data centers supported more than 112,000 Virginia jobs](#) that contributed over \$1.5 billion in annual state tax revenue. The data centers generated nearly \$40 billion in total economic impact statewide.

Opposition To Data Centers

CLAIM: Opposition to data centers is wholly organic to local concerns.

FACTS:

- X (formerly Twitter) uncovered a bot farm of around 200,000 Chinese inauthentic accounts that were posting in a way to distort the conversation around U.S. artificial intelligence, data centers, and energy policy. 200 of these [fake Chinese accounts created posts with false anti-data center talking points](#).
 - It has been reported that “it appears [Chinese propaganda has infiltrated American](#) circles with the hope of slowing the U.S. down” by trying to negatively influence AI data centers.
- The [left-wing network behind the “No Kings” and other protests is helping to lead opposition against data centers](#). This network includes organizations funded by Neville Roy Singham, a Shanghai-based businessman, who is pro-China. His media network and nonprofit have faced Congressional scrutiny over its funding and foreign ties.

Electricity Costs & Environmental Impacts

CLAIM:

- Regular ratepayers are subsidizing data centers.

FACTS:

- On August 11, 2026, CenterPoint Energy announced a “Customer Savings Initiative” to [reduce Texas electric customers' costs](#) by more than \$5 billion over the next 10 years. The savings are related to 14 gigawatts of planned baseload power for data centers, which would pay for the cost of expanding baseload power.

- In August 2026, Indiana Michigan Power announced it was filing a rate decrease request with the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission. This would result in a [5 percent cost reduction \(\\$100 a year\) and a three-year freeze on electric bills](#). Indiana Michigan Power said that data centers operated by Amazon and Microsoft are paying more than their fair share.
- In August 2026, Georgia Power announced customers could expect to see an [additional savings of \\$15 per month beginning in 2029](#). This is in addition to a 2025 commitment to pass on savings of \$102 to \$180 a year. This is the results of new large-load customers like data centers.
 - A recent contract with OpenAI ensured the company would [pay the full costs of infrastructure for 3.2 GWs of new demand](#) and provide up to 1,000 MW of flexible demand for Georgia Power's regular customers, reducing costs for them.
- PG&E has said that data center growth has allowed the company to [cut rates by 11 percent since 2024](#). The utility has stated it can decrease customer bills by 1 percent to percent for every 1 GW of additional load growth. It has lined up [10 GW of future data center projects](#).

CLAIM:

- Data centers consume excessive amounts of water.

FACTS:

- Newer data center facilities have [reduced the use of freshwater by adopting closed-loop cooling systems](#) or using reclaimed wastewater.
- Older data centers rely on mechanical chillers or heat exchangers that [don't consume water for cooling](#).
- [Golf courses](#) use 2.08 billion gallons of water per day compared to only 449 million gallons of water per day used by data centers.

CLAIM:

- Data centers produce excessive noise.

FACTS:

- A study found that the noise of data centers is [comparable to noise emitted by everyday activities](#) such as normal conversation or ambient library sounds.
- The data center industry is moving toward liquid cooling, removing the necessity for louder fans. This can [reduce the noise of a data center by more than 50 percent](#).
