Neville Roy Singham is an American businessman who sold his tech company for \$785 million, moved to Shanghai, and has since funneled hundreds of millions of dollars into a global network of far-left groups working to undermine American foreign policy.

Singham has been involved with organizations such as:

- [The ANSWER Coalition](#), a radical anti-war advocacy group with ties to Hamas and Iran, which has [partnered](#) with The People's Forum and CODEPINK on events protesting against American foreign policy.
- [The Democratic Socialists of America](#), a far-left political activist group, has been reported as working with CODEPINK in support of the Chinese Communist Party.
- [The Party for Socialism and Liberation](#), a leftist socialist political party which has publicly supported Communist leaders such as Vladimir Lenin and Mao Zedong, has participated in protests against American foreign policy with organizations including CODEPINK.

Executive Summary

Neville Roy Singham is an American businessman who has financed a network of entities which have advocated for far-left causes, including speaking in support of the Chinese Communist Party and Russia. Singham is estimated to have invested at least \$278 million in U.S.-based grants and as much as \$600 million across the globes in support of his network.

The organizations which have connections to Singham are numerous, and include The People's Forum, The Venceremos Brigade, The United Community Fund, Justice and Education Fund, BreakThrough News, and CODEPINK. Through these organizations, Singham's entities have been connected to other far-left advocacy groups including the ANSWER Coalition, the Democratic Socialists of America, and the Party for Socialism and Liberalism.

Who Is Singham

- Neville Roy Singham is an American businessman, who [founded](#) and served as chairman of Thoughtworks, an IT consulting firm, before [selling](#) the company for \$785 million.
- Singham is a [former member](#) of the League of Revolutionary Black Workers, a Black nationalist-Maoist group. Singham was investigated by the FBI in 1974 as "potentially dangerous."
- Singham [resides](#) in Shanghai, China and is married to Jodie Evans, co-founder of anti-war activist group CODEPINK.
- Within China, Singham has [consulted](#) for Huawei, launched a consulting business with partners in the Chinese Communist Party's publicity department, established co-ownership of a "media company" tied to Tongren City, Guizhou province, and has shared office space with a company whose goal is to educate foreigners about "the miracles that China has created on the world stage."

Far-Left Network

- Singham has been [identified](#) as directing hundreds of millions of dollars toward far-left causes, media organizations, and political groups globally.
- A 2026 Fox News investigative series [alleged](#) the total network spans over \$278 million in U.S.-based grants since 2017, and potentially as much as \$600 million globally across five continents, operating through nonprofits, activist groups, think tanks, and media outlets.
- An investigative report by *The New York Times* [identified](#) Singham as a major contributor to a wide network of organizations, including non-profits in the U.S., which have worked to praise the Chinese Government and its leadership.
- Despite many of the entities Singham have [advocated](#) for China, they are not [required](#) to register under FARA, a point of significant congressional frustration.

Members Of Singham's Network

- Organizations which Singham has been affiliated with include:
 - The People's Forum, a far-left 501(c)(3) nonprofit activist group, has been allegedly [supported](#) by at least \$25 million from Singham associated groups. The People's Forum have [celebrated](#) the October 7, 2023, Hamas attack on Israel and have spoken in support of the government of Iran.
 - The Venceremos Brigade, an organization which organizes trips to communist-Cuba for sympathetic Americans to demonstrate their opposition to the United States policy towards Cuba, has been [sponsored](#) by The People's Forum.
 - The [United Community Fund](#) and the [Justice and Education Fund](#), policy organizations which follow a left-of-center agenda regarding wealth equity, which exist entirely as UPS store mailboxes in the United States.
 - BreakThrough News, an [online media outlet](#) which is staffed by veterans of Russian state-affiliated outlets and has been accused of pushing pro-China and pro-Russia narratives.
 - CODEPINK, a left-wing advocacy group [founded](#) by Jodie Evans, which has [received](#) significant funding from grantmaking entities linked to the Chinese Communist Party, and has issued numerous pro-China statements including [calling](#) on the United States government to treat China more favorably.
